National School Lunch Program

EPCC participates in the National School Breakfast and Lunch Program (NSLP) during the school year and the Summer Meal Program during the Summer school break. As you may already know, EPCC has an ongrounds school in which all our children receive education from EVSC teachers according to their current grade level. Our kids qualify for free school breakfasts and lunches while they are enrolled at EPCC. EPCC receives reimbursement from USDA for meals and snacks served to kids during the school day.

In order to maintain our participation in the National School Breakfast and Lunch Program and continue to receive reimbursement, EPCC must be audited by a representative from the State of Indiana every three years to ensure we are meeting the guidelines of the program. EPCC was visited by the representative for an audit on December 30, 2019.

EPCC must maintain a Wellness policy to ensure that NSLP guidelines will be met. The policy includes everything from forming and maintaining a Dietary Committee for the purpose of reviewing and implementing the NSLP guidelines, promotion of healthy eating and providing the children with nutrition education, to making sure the children receive plenty of physical activity and play time during the school day. EPCC receives its meal and snack services daily from Cura, a contracted foodservice company. Cura staff are responsible for ensuring meals are served efficiently, fresh and at the right temperatures, the correct portions are served, and the meals are appealing to the children. Cura staff prepare our children's meals at Evansville State Hospital and transport the food to be served from EPCC's kitchen. Cura staff are also responsible for keeping the kitchen clean and sanitary according to NSLP guidelines as well.

Our children and their families will be offered information about free and reduced price lunches and locations of summer and after-school meal programs when they are discharged from our facility. Our goal is to make sure that our children continue to remain well-nourished and lead healthy lifestyles once they return home. Making EPCC's Vision of "children making positive life choices and contributions to their community" successful depends on collaboration from EPCC staff, contract dietary staff, families, and other interested community members.
