Our Summer Enrichment Program is provided by two EVSC teachers. We are grateful to have our teachers who return each year to help our kids practice the skills they have learned all year, and provide lessons on interesting subjects such as All About Me, Sports, Plants and Animals, the USA, Under the Sea, Safety and First Responders, and Careers/ Occupations.

The children also participated in special Recreation Therapy programming held in the gym each day after Summer Enrichment, as they do every year. We feel that not only academic education is important to continue year round, but we work hard to supplement the children's physical education year round as well. We are fortunate to have a wonderful gymnasium and playground on our campus to provide opportunities for our kids to experience plenty of fresh air and sunshine.

It's that time of year once again! We say goodbye to leisurely summer days filled with sun and fun, and resume our routine of attending classes and working hard to make the grade. EPCC is very fortunate to have a beautiful campus bordered by parts of the Wesselman Woods and Pigeon Creek areas. Our campus includes acres of green space that we utilize for our playground, gardens, flower beds, etc. However, a lot of our grounds are wooded areas that have been underutilized...until now.

We were extremely fortunate to have the opportunity to collaborate with IU School of Medicine in Evansville, particularly their Alumni Association, in order to create a beautiful Nature Trail on which EPCC's children can spend time walking, enjoying sunshine and shade, fresh air, and learning about nature.

On Saturday, August 10th, several volunteers started out bright and early in the morning with clearing away brush and debris in order to carve out a nice pathway for enjoying the beautiful nature scene. Once everything was determined clear and safe for children and staff to enjoy, another crew of approximately 30 volunteers, all IUSOM students, arrived promptly at 1:00 in the afternoon to spread mulch to create a nice soft, safe surface for the trail, and to double-check the area for safety and tidiness.

After all the work was completed, the trail was made official by dedicating it with a plaque created by our psychiatrist, Dr. Shannon Jones. This nature trail was her wish, and the IUSOM students, Alumni Association Director and friends made it happen.

After the dedication, the children were escorted by staff to the trail. This trail was a surprise to them up to this point. They were very excited! Some comments that were heard from the children were "This is so cool!", "I can't wait to

walk through the woods!", and "I'm ready to find all the bugs!"

The kids and staff of EPCC would like to sincerely thank Aaron Costlow, IUSOM med student and Amber Embrey, IUSOM Director of Alumni Association for organizing this project with us, and all other med students and friends who generously gave of their time, talents, equipment, and energy to work in the summer heat and make this wish a reality.
