Peer Support Roles...

- Inspire hope that people can and do recover
- Walk with people on their recovery journeys
- Dispel myths about what it means to have a mental health condition or substance use disorder
- Provide self--help education and link people to tools and resources
- Support people in identifying their goals, hopes and dreams, and creating a roadmap for getting there

Being a Peer Support Means...

- Attending Treatment Team Meetings and Hospital Committee Meetings
- Helping develop and revise policies and procedures
- Protecting consumers' or patients' rights
- Assisting in the mediation of consumer or patient conflicts/ complaints
- Facilitating peer support groups
- Assisting with discharge transition
- Participating in the debriefing process and significant event review
- Supporting cultural change through inclusion of service recipients

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Being a Peer Support Means...

- Engaging peers in collaborating relationships
- Sharing experiences of recovery
- Assisting peers to manage crisis
- Participating in physical and design changes
- Providing input into program design



Joint Commission Readiness Mitzi Lawson, Performance Improvement

National Patient Safety Goals (NPSG) Chapter

Each year The Joint Commission gathers information about emerging patient safety issues from widely recognized experts and stakeholders. This information is the basis for the National Patient Safety Goals. This information is tailored to specific accredited programs. The information gathered is also used for sentinel event alerts, standards and survey process, performance measures, educational material and Joint Commission Center for Transforming Healthcare projects.

The National Patient Safety Goals that impact Madison State Hospital are listed below:

NPSG.01.01.01 - Use at least two patient identifiers when providing care, treatment, and services.

NPSG.02.03.01 - Report critical results of tests and diagnostic procedures on a timely basis.

NPSG.03.04.01 - Label all medications, medication containers, and other solutions on and off the sterile field in perioperative and other procedural settings. Note: Medication containers include syringes, medicine cups, and basins.



NPSG.03.05.01 - Reduce the likelihood of patient harm associated with the use of anticoagulant therapy.

Note: This requirement does not apply to routine situations in which short-term prophylactic anticoagulation is used for preventing venous thromboembolism (for example, related to procedures or hospitalization).

NPSG.03.06.01 - Maintain and communicate accurate patient medication information.

NPSG.06.01.01 - Improve the safety of clinical alarm systems.

NPSG.07.01.01 - Comply with either the current Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) hand hygiene guidelines and/or the current World Health Organization (WHO) hand hygiene guidelines.

NPSG.15.01.01 - Reduce the risk for suicide. Note: EPs 2–7 apply to patients in psychiatric hospitals or patients being evaluated or treated for behavioral health conditions as their primary reason for care. In addition, EPs 3–7 apply to all patients who express suicidal ideation during the course of care.


AHRQ SOPS[®] Hospital Survey
