2023 INDIANA LEGISLATIVE SESSION ACHIEVEMENTS

FISCAL CONDITION

- **10th Straight Balanced Budget \$44.5B**
- Maintains AAA state credit rating
- ☑ Cut Personal Income taxes to 2.9% by 2027
- Eliminated Personal Income taxes for Active Duty, National Guard and reserve members already receive a \$5,000 deduction, and a full income tax exemption when mobilized or on duty
- Paid down Debt: Paid down \$700M in 2023 and another \$3.1B FY 24-25 on our Pre-96 Teachers Fund. Since 2011, we have shaved off 30 years of payments
- Reserves 12% = S3B (FY24/25 \$909M/\$541M Cash funded New State Archives Building \$97M, New world class Colocated Schools for the Deaf & the Blind and Visually Impaired & 253M. New Potato Creek State Park Lodge \$100M, Armories \$25M, Deferred Maintenance \$150M, McCormicks Creek State Park Tornado Recovery Rebuild \$5M, and initial phases of a New Westville Correctional Facility \$800M.
- Passed temporary property tax relief to shield homeowners from taxes continuing to climb and added a cost-of-living adjustment to the homestead tax deduction for Hoosiers over 65 and broadened the definition of homestead to protect homeowners against taxation beyond the intent of Indiana's constitutional property tax caps.
