

INDIANA'S ECONOMIC TIES TO JAPAN

- As of last year, more than **250 Japanese business facilities** operated across Indiana, employing more than 52,000 associates.
(Consulate General of Japan at Chicago)

- Exporting \$1.6 billion of Hoosier-made goods to Japan, Indiana counts Japan as its **largest Asian trading partner** and **third-largest export country** in the world.
(U.S. Department of Commerce's National Trade Database)

- Among all U.S. states, **Indiana has the largest amount of Japanese investment** per capita.

- Indiana is the **only U.S. state** that is home to **three Japanese original equipment manufacturer (OEM)** automotive companies (Subaru, Toyota and Honda).

- Indiana leadership has **annually led a jobs mission** to Japan since 2005.

JAPANESE SISTER-STATE RELATIONSHIP

- The **Indiana-Tochigi Prefecture** relationship dates back to 1999 when Indiana became a sister state with Tochigi Prefecture.



- Following Governor Pence's visit to Tochigi Prefecture in 2013, Indiana had its first investment from a company in its sister state in 2014. Fukai Toyotetsu Indiana announced that it is locating a facility and 195 Hoosier jobs in Jamestown, Indiana.

IEDC JAPANESE PROJECTS

- Since 2005, the IEDC has secured projects with more than 100 Japan-based companies, projecting to create nearly 13,000 new jobs and invest more than \$4 billion in their Indiana operations.

- Recent highlights:

JUNE 2015: Chiyoda USA announced plans to build a new 90,000-square-foot facility at its U.S. headquarters in Greencastle, creating up to 300 new jobs by 2017.

AUGUST 2014: Toyota Indiana announced plans to invest \$100 million into its Princeton operation, boosting Highlander production and creating up to 300 new jobs by 2016.

June 2014: MonoSol announced plans to locate a new facility in Portage, creating up to 150 new jobs by 2020.

MAY 2014: Aisin Chemical Indiana and Aisin Drivetrain announced plans to invest \$45.35 million into their Crothersville operations, creating up to 74 new jobs by 2016.

APRIL 2014: Subaru and Toyota supplier TOA announced plans to invest \$72.1 million to expand its Mooresville facility by 360,000 square feet, creating up to 220 new jobs by 2015.



INDIANA-JAPAN EDUCATIONAL TIES

- Five Japanese-language Saturday schools** teach students throughout Indiana.

- Many major Indiana universities and colleges have partnerships with Japanese universities.

- More than 4,400 Hoosier students at 45 schools across the state participate in Japanese language programs.
