**RE:** Additional InTERS Reporting Allowances for Entrepreneurship Capstone Course

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**Summary:** The State Board of Education (SBOE) approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) course amendments for the 2019-2020 Course Titles and Descriptions on August 7, 2019. Clarification is provided below.

**Background:** [Amendments to the 2019-2020 Course Titles and Descriptions](#) were approved by the SBOE on August 7, 2019, that allowed required prerequisites for (5966) Entrepreneurship and New Ventures Capstone course to be expanded to include greater flexibility.

Per SBOE approval, four (4) credits in any of the courses listed below will count toward meeting the required prerequisite criteria:

- (4524) Intro to Accounting,
- (4522) Advanced Accounting,
- (4518) Introduction to Business,
- (5967) Introduction to Entrepreneurship,
- (4562) Principles of Business Management,
- (5914) Principles of Marketing,
- (5918) Strategic Marketing,
- (4560) Business Law and Ethics, or
- (4558) Global Economics

**Guidance:** To allow for current juniors and seniors to remain eligible for CTE Concentrator status for the Entrepreneurship and New Ventures Capstone course, business rules within InTERs, the CTE data collection portal, will also accept credits in:

- (5428) Digital Applications and
- (5967) Introduction to Entrepreneurship.

These two courses were listed as required prerequisites in the 2018-2019 Course Titles and Descriptions. In addition to the courses listed above, these will satisfy the requirement for four (4) prerequisite credits for the Entrepreneurship and New Ventures Capstone course for the 2020 and 2021 graduating classes.
