Problem- Job openings and the construction labor shortage

As of January 2023, there are nearly 250,000 job openings in the construction industry nationwide. The Association of Builders and Contractors estimates over 340,000 new workers will need to be hired in 2024 to keep up with demand. Keep in mind that number is in addition to normal hiring activities, bringing the grand total of the construction labor shortage to 546,000.

Investment in Improving Infrastructure

- Indiana passed long-term infrastructure funding in 2017 (Holcomb)
 - 20-year plan to improve Indiana's roads and bridges
- Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Signed into Law in 2021
 - Authorizes \$1.2 trillion for U.S. transportation and infrastructure projects
 - Indiana Nearly \$8 Billion guaranteed for Indiana and opportunities for more


Duneland Partnership
