Spotlight: Lung Cancer

 Lung cancer is not a single disease; rather it is a group of cancers that originate in the lung and associated tissues. Lung cancers are divided into three major types: small cell lung cancer (SCLC), non-small lung cancer (NSCLC) and lung carcinoid tumors. Lung cancer accounts for more deaths than any

other cancer in men and women.¹

- Overall, lung cancer mortality rates are about three times higher for smokers than for people who never smoked.²
- More than 1 million adults in Indiana smoke cigarettes with Indiana's adult smoking rate being 19.4 in 2020 which was above the national adult smoking rate in the United States of 15.5.1
- Exposure to radon gas is the second-leading cause of lung cancer in the United States³
- The United States Preventive Services Task Force recommends annual screening for lung cancer with low dose computed tomography in adults aged 50 to 80 years who have a 20-pack-per-year smoking history and currently smoke, or who have quit within the past 15 years ⁴
