

About Healthcare Coalitions

Indiana has 10 healthcare coalitions (HCC), one located in each district. HCCs build relationships to strengthen response to emergencies that impact the healthcare system. HCCs serve an important communication and coordination role within their jurisdictions, given the many public and private entities that must come together to ensure healthcare delivery system readiness.

Healthcare Coalition's Role in Dialysis Response

Healthcare coalitions and local health departments are encouraged to develop partnerships with dialysis centers and end-stage renal disease (ESRD) networks to:

- Ensure coordinated planning and delivery of disaster clinical care
- Use de-identified data and mapping CMS data to pre-identify ESRD dialysis dependent populations in the affected area to anticipate and plan for dialysis facility and hospital surge planning and transportation needs
- Identification of facilities with the capacity for dialysis walk in patients or patients experiencing an exacerbation of ESRD
