TO REPORT:

NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in **NBS**

Non-NBS users: Report using,

- **<u>REDCap Form</u>** -OR-
- Fax a communicable disease form

Associated Reportable Laboratory Results

- Darkfield microscopy of lesions, body fluids, or neonatal nasal discharge
- Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) or other equivalent direct molecular methods of lesions, neonatal nasal discharge, placenta, umbilical cord, or autopsy material
- Immunohistochemistry (IHC), or special stains (e.g., silver staining) of specimens from lesions, placenta, umbilical cord, or autopsy material.
- Non-treponemal test for syphilis (Venereal Disease Research Laboratory [VDRL], rapid plasma reagin [RPR], or equivalent serologic methods)

Condition Specific Reporting Details

- Within the NBS Morbidity Report:
 - Patient information (as much as possible)
 - Facility/Provider and Clinical information
 - Skip this section: Epidemiological information
 - Lab Report and Treatment information

Additional Documentation to Include

- **Required**: Add medical record notes as attachments, especially those including:
- Results from infectious disease or microbiology, CSF studies, hematology, chemistries, or radiology.
- Provider notes sections, including: History and Physical, discharge summary, and progress notes.
