

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for this program, you must:

- Live in the state of Indiana
- Have a HIV-positive diagnosis
- Have an income level below 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
- Have no other comprehensive insurance coverage available through employer insurance, spouse/partner, parent, private insurance, Medicaid or Medicare
- Work with a case manager at a Ryan White-funded care site to enroll and maintain enrollment in this program

Talk with your case manager to see if you are eligible.

Coverage Issues

If you receive a bill or your pharmacy asks you to pay for your prescriptions, contact your case manager right away. They can work with the HIV Services Program to review the situation and help resolve any issues.


Important Reminder: ADAP/EIP does not cover costs for inpatient care or emergency room visits. That's why it's essential to talk with your case manager about getting comprehensive health coverage—so you're covered in every situation.

AIDS Drug Assistance Program and Early Intervention Program

As you work toward obtaining comprehensive coverage, you may be eligible to receive medications and medical services at no cost—helping you stay healthy and continue your care without interruption.

Overview

ADAP/EIP consists of two programs: the **AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)** and the **Early Intervention Program (EIP)**.

ADAP is a medication assistance program that provides access to a limited selection of FDA-approved medications specifically for the treatment of HIV and related conditions. It is not considered health insurance. ADAP pays 100% for medications that are on the ADAP/EIP Formulary. Prescriptions can be filled at any pharmacy of your choice.


EIP pays 100% for a limited number of medical services such as provider visits and lab services. If you are hospitalized or need to go to the emergency room, EIP will not cover any inpatient costs.

This program is only meant to be used for a short span of time until comprehensive insurance becomes available.

How does the program work?

The program is administered by ProCareRX and Unified Group. ProCareRX oversees prescription benefits, while Unified Group manages medical benefits.

You will receive a card in the mail from Unified Group, similar to the one shown below.



What does the program cover?

The program covers a limited selection of medications and medical services, as listed in the ADAP/EIP Formulary. Medications are included in the ADAP section, while medical services are outlined in the EIP Listing. The formulary is updated regularly as new treatments and services are added.

When will coverage be active?

This program will be active the Friday of the week the application is processed by the HIV Services Program (Monday through Thursday). If processed on a Friday, it will become active the following Friday.

How long can I stay on it?

Please note that this is not a comprehensive insurance plan. With support from your case manager, you should apply for coverage through Medicaid, Medicare, the Marketplace, or your employer's insurance as soon as possible. You may continue receiving services through ADAP/EIP until your new coverage becomes active.

Tips

- To prevent any coverage interruptions, be sure to renew your program enrollment with your case manager every six months. You will need to renew during your birth month and again six months later. During your visit, be sure to talk with your case manager about enrolling in comprehensive health care coverage that best supports your medical needs for the upcoming year.
- Bring your Unified Group card to all doctor visits, lab appointments, and pharmacy visits. Providers will need it to bill the program correctly.
- Ask your case manager for a copy of the ADAP/EIP Formulary so you can share it with your medical provider when discussing your care and treatment options.
