- NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in NBS
- Non-NBS users: Report with <u>this</u> form

Associated Reportable Laboratory Results

Bacterial isolation of Coxiella burnetii; IgG titers to C. burnetii phase I or II antigen by IFA,
ELISA, or dot-ELISA; demonstration of C. burnetii by immunohistochemistry (IHC); or detection of C. burnetii DNA by polymerase chain reaction (PCR)

Condition Specific Reporting Details

• Complete Clinical, Epidemiologic, Lab Report and Treatment information sections within the NBS Morbidity Report

Additional Documentation to Include

- Applicable medical records (if available) including outpatient office visits, specialty consults, emergency department/hospital discharge summaries, and pertinent labs and imaging
- Travel history, known animal or potential unpasteurized dairy exposures (imported cheeses, raw milk), and lab exposures
- Name and contact information of follow-up provider should be listed in the Administrative Comments section of the morbidity report
