

# Updates

# **Rifapentine and Rifampin shortages**

- Continue to experience shortages of Rifapentine and Rifampin at the national level
- IDOH utilizes several avenues to secure additional stock:
  - CDC national stockpile
  - Partnership with other state/big city TB programs
- IDOH and Purdue Pharmacy will continue to monitor the situation.



# **Uniting For Ukraine and TB screening**

- Uniting for Ukraine provides a pathway for Ukrainian citizens and their immediate family members to come to the United States and stay temporarily in a two-year period of parole.
- Participants are eligible to receive a domestic refugee health assessment and are required to complete vaccine attestations and a tuberculosis (TB) screening.

o IGRA only (i.e. no TSTs), completed within 90 days of U.S. arrival

- IDOH can link arrivals to a screening clinic and/or provide reimbursement for costs associated with the required screenings.
  - Clinical costs, transportation, interpretation, outreach
  - Utilize specific Hoosier Uplands form



# Additional parolee TB screening

- Similar model to U4U being utilized for parolees from additional countries
  - Venezuela, Nicaragua, Cuba, and Haiti
- Required to have IGRA within 90 days but may not be eligible for complete refugee health screening
- Funding is available through Hoosier Uplands to reimburse costs related to TB screening and outreach for these groups
  - This is a recent change.

#### QuantiFERON-TB Gold Plus Reminder

- Available at the IDOH Lab
  - Single tube collection available
  - Packaging and shipping materials provided
  - Free to *local health departments* with patient insurance information
    - \$20 per test without insurance information

**Phlebotomy Training** 

 IDOH Emergency Preparedness Division planning to provide district/regional-based training via mobile units





# **Upcoming changes to reporting**

- The Indiana Communicable Disease rule will be updated effective **April 1, 2023.**
- TB disease (cases and suspects) and LTBI will remain reportable.
- Reporting timeframe will now be within one working day (both conditions)
- Changes to control measures and online reporting options in process



# **RVCT updates**

- CDC released an updated Report of Verified Case of TB (RVCT) Form in 2020.
  - Known as TB Investigation in NBS
- NBS update to align with new form rolled out in March

- IDOH team is available to help with transition.



# **Updated IJN forms**

- Revised inter-jurisdictional TB notification (IJN) forms were released in August 2022.

### **TB disease treatment and management card**

- Updates to the IDOH treatment and management of TB disease card are in progress to add the new four-month treatment option that CDC provided interim recommendations for during February 2022.
  - This treatment regimen consists of:
    - Rifapentine
    - Moxifloxacin
    - Isoniazid
    - Pyrazinamide

#### TB and people experiencing homelessness

- On Jan. 27, 2023, <u>Public Health Reports</u>, released "<u>Diagnosis</u>, <u>Treatment</u>, and Prevention of Tuberculosis Among People <u>Experiencing Homelessness in the United States</u>."
- This document provides a summary of existing guidelines and information in one place to inform medical and public health providers and TB programs on TB incidence, diagnosis, and treatment among persons experiencing homelessness.



# **CDC LTBI campaign**

- In March 2022, CDC launched a campaign to raise awareness of LTBI called "Think, Test, Treat TB."
- The campaign aims to raise awareness about LTBI, risk, and the link between LTBI and TB disease.
- Free resources are available in multiple languages, including TB messages, digital and print resources, patient and provider education materials, and a partner toolkit.


