## **Condition Name:**

# **Condition Name in NBS:**

## **Reporting Timeframe:**

Within One Working Day

# **TO REPORT:**

- NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in <u>NBS</u>
- Non-NBS users: Report with <u>this</u> form

### **Associated Reportable Laboratory Results**

• Vancomycin resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (VRSA) and Vancomycin intermediate *Staphylococcus aureus* (VISA) from any site

#### **Condition Specific Reporting Details**

 Clinical, Epidemiological, Lab Report, and Treatment information sections within the NBS Morbidity Report

## **Additional Documentation to Include**

- Completed <u>VISA/VRSA Reporting Form</u>
- Culture and antimicrobial susceptibility results
- History and physical, most recent admission and discharge notes, any Infection disease doctor's note
