### **TO REPORT:**

- NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in NBS
- Non-NBS users: Report with this form

## **Associated Reportable Laboratory Results**

- Isolation of yellow fever virus, viral antigen/nucleic acid in tissue, blood, CSF, or other body fluid; Antibody titers in paired sera; IgM antibodies in CSF or serum, negative IgM results
- If positive, forward specimen to IDOH Labs for further testing

# **Condition Specific Reporting Details**

• Clinical, Epidemiologic, Lab Report, and Treatment information sections within the NBS Morbidity Report

### **Additional Documentation to Include**

- Applicable medical records (if available) including outpatient office visits, Specialty Consults, and Emergency Department/Hospital Discharge Summaries.
- CSF studies
- Negative results for other arboviral IgM antibodies or documentation of recent vaccination against a flavivirus (e.g., WNV, YFV, JEV)
- Recent travel history
