The History of Tuberculosis in Indiana

Dr. Ellen Einterz is a family medicine physician with the Marion County Public Health Department's Global Health Clinic. She holds undergraduate degrees from McGill (Montreal) and Indiana Universities, her MD from McGill, and a master's degree in public health and tropical medicine from Tulane. She served as a Peace Corps volunteer

in Niger for two years and then as medical director for hospitals in Nigeria and Cameroon for over three decades. During the 2014/2015 Ebola epidemic, she was medical coordinator of a fifty-bed Ebola Treatment Unit in Liberia. Dr. Einterz has published articles on a wide range of topics including snakebite, malaria, international aid, tuberculosis, neonatal tetanus, family planning, traditional uvulectomy, telemedicine, trachoma, and access to healthcare in underserved parts of the world. She maintains adjunct faculty appointments with the Indiana University School of Medicine and the Fairbanks School of Public Health, and she is the author of *Life and Death in Kolofata: An American doctor in Africa* (Indiana University Press, 2018).

Latent TB Infection Treatment Guidelines

Bradley Allen grew up on a farm in Iowa and did his undergraduate at the University of Iowa. He stayed at Iowa for MD/PhD training with his doctoral work in Microbiology. He completed residency in Internal Medicine at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas. Brad returned to the University of Iowa for fellowship training in Infectious Diseases before joining their faculty.

Dr. Allen moved to Indianapolis and joined the Indiana University School of Medicine's Division of Infectious Diseases in 2000. He later became Chief of Medicine at the Roudebush Veterans Affairs Medical Center and then moved to the role of Vice Chairman for Education in the Department of Medicine. Bradley currently serves as Senior Associate Dean for Medical Student Education and the D. Craig Brater Scholar in Professionalism, as well as Associate Professor of Clinical Medicine and Infectious Diseases for IUSM. His duties include oversight and management of the curriculum and student support delivered throughout the statewide IUSM system. IUSM is the largest medical school in the U.S., with over 1400 students studying across 9 campuses statewide. Recently IUSM received a \$7 million federal HRSA grant to enhance the training of students in primary care delivery to the underserved of Indiana with a focus on healthcare disparities and systemic racism.

Dr. Allen serves as the Medical Consultant for the Tuberculosis Control Program for the Indiana Department of Health and practices in ID and HIV care at the Indianapolis VAMC. He is an avid bicyclist, Habitat for Humanity volunteer, and enjoys traveling with his wife Anne.
