Overdoses Emerge as Leading Cause of Death in Marion County

In its annual report examining trends among the decedents it receives, the <u>Marion County Coroner's Office</u> recorded 799 people last year who died from accidental drug intoxication. This is an increase from 640 accidental drug overdose deaths in 2020, marking the second year where the count of drug overdose deaths has surpassed cardiovascular deaths. "It's unfortunate that these deaths are rising at such a significant rate," said Alfarena McGinty, chief deputy coroner.

The majority of deaths are linked to fentanyl, the report shows, accounting for nearly 78% of the deaths. Fentanyl has increasingly been cut in other street drugs in the past few years across the country, oftentimes without the user's knowledge.

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Dove Recovery House for Women Announce New Hires

Dove House will open in Jasper, in November 2022. Megan Durlauf has been named director of operations, and Dana Wood is clinical manager. They are the first hires for the new Dove House facility, which will house up to 15 women.

"Dove House is filling a huge unmet need in our rural community," Durlauf said. "I have witnessed countless women released from jail with nowhere to go except back to the people they were using substances with when they were arrested. I want to be part of the solution for women who need that safe space to get back on their feet."

Wood shared that "being able to provide treatment where women can remain in the community and retain positive connections is beyond words. I hope to provide a safe space for women to come when they are at their most vulnerable and provide the support to help them thrive in their lives."



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Opioid Treatment Center Moving from Downtown Indianapolis to Twin Aire

The planned treatment center move to southeast of downtown Indianapolis, and will be run by Eskenazi Health. "What we really like about Twin Aire is proximity to current patients," said Dr. Overley of Eskenazi Health. Transportation is a consistent barrier to treatment. With a closer clinic, it will be more likely that people can access treatment. The clinic, which offers methadone treatments is only one of two in Marion County. Eskenazi said the approval of the development will allow providers to almost double the number of patients they serve.

Eskenazi has a goal to open the new location by November 2023.

Young people are struggling with mental health and substance use now more than ever. But why? Has it always been this way? Or did things get much worse following the COVID-19 pandemic?


