Providing free rides could help people in addiction recovery

Indiana zeroed in on addressing the transportation needs of people in recovery from addiction and launched a partnership with Lyft to provide free rides to people to and from addiction treatment and recovery programs.

The Indiana Recovery Network – a statewide collaboration of recovery organizations – expanded on the state's efforts to provide free rides to people in recovery through Lyft. The program is available to anyone actively engaged with one of Indiana Recovery Network's 20 regional recovery hubs. Rides are free for anything as long as it relates to the four pillars of recovery: home, health, community and purpose.

Multimedia campaign will address addiction issues, health disparities in Southern Indiana

The Clark County Health Department is partnering with a local entrepreneur on a multimedia campaign to bring attention to substance use disorder and health disparities in southern Indiana. Health Officer Dr. Eric Yazel and Miguel Hampton have been discussing ways to promote health equity. The two are preparing for a series of community panels, podcasts and a short documentary.

The project will help tackle addiction issues in the community, with a focus on equity and diversity. Yazel and Hampton expect to kick off the awareness campaign in the coming months. Hampton said they could start recording the podcast within the next month. The first season could include about 10 to 12 episodes.


Free Community Narcan Training
