# **SPEAKERS**

#### Ralph King, BS, AEMT

Ralph King is a fire captain with the Clark County Fire Department (CCFD) servicing the greater Las Vegas, Nevada area, including the Las Vegas Strip. He has been employed by the CCFD for over 22 years, and a supervisor for the last 13 years. Certified as an A-EMT for the duration of his career, Ralph operates under the Southern Nevada Health District. Ralph spent three years at Oklahoma State University, School of Fire Protection and Engineering Technology and completed his BS from Colorado State University in fire and emergency service administration. Captain King has been recognized by Clark County and the CCFD for his actions as one of the first fire/EMS crews to respond to the Route 91 Harvest Festival on October 1, 2017. More than 60 fatalities and nearly 900 additional wounded, making this the deadliest mass shooting by a single gunman in U.S. history. Captain Ralph King lives in a suburb of Las Vegas with his wife, daughter and stepson.

### Martin Schreiber, MD, FACS, FCCM

Martin Schreiber, MD, is the trauma medical director and chief of the Division of Trauma, Critical Care and Acute Care Surgery at Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU), the only academic Level 1 trauma center in Oregon. He received his medical degree in 1988 from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Schreiber completed his internship at Madigan Army Medical Center in Fort Lewis, Washington, and his residency training at the University of Washington in Seattle. His trauma and critical care fellowship was completed at the University of Washington. He is the immediate past chairman of the Trauma Center Association of America. Dr. Schreiber is a colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve and has been deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan and he has served as the Joint Theater Trauma System director. He is an adjunct professor of surgery at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. Dr. Schreiber is also the director of the Trauma Research Laboratory, the Army Civilian Trauma Training Team and the Donald D. Trunkey Center for Civilian and Combat Casualty Care at OHSU. His research interests include prehospital treatment of traumatic brain injury, resuscitation of hemorrhagic shock, hemorrhage control and development of novel blood products. Current funding sources include the Department of Defense, the NIH and private industry. Dr. Schreiber has over 580 total publications.

### Mauricio Lynn, MD, FACS, FSCCM

Mauricio Lynn, MD, is a professor of surgery and practices as a trauma surgeon and critical care specialist at Jackson Memorial Medical Center affiliated with the University of Miami. He is director of the Trauma Resuscitation Unit at the Ryder Trauma Center, medical director of the Center for Bloodless Medicine and Surgery, medical director of the Mass Casualty Program and the medical director of the Ryder Trauma Center International program. Dr. Lynn finished his medical school at the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He trained in general surgery at Tel Aviv University/Sheba Medical Center in Israel and did a Trauma Critical Care fellowship at the Ryder Trauma Center in Miami, Florida. Dr. Lynn is a retired lieutenant colonel from the Israeli military, where he served for 18 years. His main positions were flight surgeon with the Israeli Air Force Special Forces, medical director of the Israeli Air Rescue and Medical Evacuation Unit and chief of trauma for the Israeli military. Dr. Lynn was the medical commander of Operation Solomon, the largest airborne humanitarian mission in history. He was the commander of the Israeli medical team deployed to Nairobi, for the bombings of the American embassy and team commander and chief surgeon of two Israeli field hospitals deployed to Turkey in the aftermath of the 1999 earthquakes. As chief of trauma and working at the Surgeon General headquarters, Dr. Lynn was in charge of policy making for field trauma care for the military, consultant for the civilian Emergency Medical Services and in charge of disaster preparedness of all Israeli hospitals, working in conjunction with the Ministry of Health. Currently, Dr. Lynn is a professor of surgery. Dr. Lynn served as disaster consultant for the Joint Commission for Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) and for Royal Caribbean Cruise Line.
