SPEAKERS

Martin Schreiber, MD, FACS, FCCM

Martin Schreiber, MD, is the trauma medical director and chief of the Division of Trauma, Critical Care and Acute Care Surgery at Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU), the only academic Level 1 trauma center in Oregon. He received his medical degree in 1988 from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Schreiber completed his internship at Madigan Army Medical Center in Fort Lewis, Washington, and his residency training at the University of Washington in Seattle. His trauma and critical care fellowship was completed at the University of Washington. He is the immediate past chairman of the Trauma Center Association of America. Dr. Schreiber is a colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve and has been deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan and he has served as the Joint Theater Trauma System director. He is an adjunct professor of surgery at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. Dr. Schreiber is also the director of the Trauma Research Laboratory, the Army Civilian Trauma Training Team and the Donald D. Trunkey Center for Civilian and Combat Casualty Care at OHSU. His research interests include prehospital treatment of traumatic brain injury, resuscitation of hemorrhagic shock, hemorrhage control and development of novel blood products. Current funding sources include the Department of Defense, the NIH and private industry. Dr. Schreiber has more than 580 total publications.

William Beck, MD

William Beck, MD, is a trauma and acute care surgeon at Parkview Health. He attended Tulane University School of Medicine in New Orleans, Louisiana, where he received his medical degree. He completed his residency at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, Tennessee and earned a surgical critical care fellowship in acute care surgery and trauma at University of Texas, Houston Health Science Center in Houston, Texas. Dr. Beck is board certified by the American Board of Surgery in surgical critical care and is an Associate Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. He is also a member of the Society for Critical Care Medicine, The Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma and H. William Scott Society.

Vanessa Convard

Vanessa Convard has been helping Hoosier families in a variety of capacities for more than 20 years. She has worked with juvenile corrections, child protective services and aging services. She is now the APS director and SEA director for the Indiana FSSA Division of Aging. Her education is focused on adult education, public service, public health and health science.

Richard Falcone, MD

Dr. Falcone graduated from New York University School of Medicine, did his general surgical training at the University of Cincinnati and his pediatric surgical fellowship at Cincinnati Children’s Hospital Medical Center. He subsequently went on to receive a master’s of public health from the Harvard School of Public Health and a master’s of medical management from Carnegie Mellon.

Dr. Falcone is a professor of surgery at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine and joined the faculty at Cincinnati Children’s in 2004. He served as the director of Trauma Services from 2009 – 2021. In 2015 he was named the Associate Chief of Staff of Surgical Services and Vice President of Perioperative Operations in 2020. In July 2023 he was named the Chief of Staff of Cincinnati Children’s Hospital. In this institutional leadership role, he is responsible for all medical operations including access, safety, experience, quality and outcomes.

He has focused his career on understanding and eliminating disparities in childhood injuries, improving pediatric injury care through research and continuous quality improvement and fostering a team of talented individuals with the goal of improving child health and eliminating injury as the leading cause of death in children. He has published more than 100 peer review articles and chaired numerous regional and national pediatric trauma committees including for the American Pediatric Surgical Association, the Trauma Center Association of America, the Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma and the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma. He is also a past president of the Pediatric Trauma Society. Most recently, he has focused on access, safety and efficiency as well as ensuring equity for all patients to ensure timely access and improved outcomes. In addition to supporting patient and family experience, he is a strong supporter of clinician experience and wellness.
