Project Description:

The Indiana Department of Health's (IDOH) Division of Trauma and Injury Prevention has been awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to improve collaboration and strategic decision-making by law enforcement agencies and public health officials to address prescription drug and opioid misuse, save lives, and reduce crime. The IDOH has also been awarded a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to collect and disseminate surveillance data on homicides, suicides, deaths of undetermined manner, and unintentional firearm deaths to improve the planning, implementation, and evaluation of violence prevention programs. As part of these efforts, IDOH aims to improve drug specificity and completeness on death certificates by providing more precise and comprehensive death data. **As such, IDOH hopes to increase coroner participation in the Indiana Coroner Case Management System (ICCMS), a repository in which coroners can manage their cases, by providing funds to cover supplies that are critical in supporting investigation efforts.** Below is a list of supplies coroners can choose from. The IDOH is open to expanding this list to include additional supplies, though items cannot exceed \$500/item. Please send recommendations to John O'Boyle, JOBoyle@IDOH.in.gov.

Eligibility:

- Respondents must be the county coroner or a designated representative from the coroner's office.
- If you have a data sharing agreement with IDOH to supply Indiana Violent Death Reporting System (INVDRS) cases and overdose cases and have not provided the requested reports to IDOH, you are not eligible for this grant. Once records have been received and you have been sent a confirmation email, funding will be released for your county.

Funding:

The total funding amount available for this program is **\$60,000**. Pages 11-13 contain a table that indicates the average number of overdose and violent deaths for each county for the last three years. Based on this information, each county is allotted a certain dollar amount that can be spent on supplies. Please select supplies based on your maximum funding amount.

Completed Grant Application Due Date: Proposals are to be submitted via e-mail to indianatrauma@isdh.in.gov before August 1, 2022. After August 1, any remaining funds will be available to all counties and will be awarded on a first come, first served basis through August 15, 2022.

Notice of Award:

Respondents will be notified of awards no later than 10 business days after receipt of their application.

Respondent Participation Guidelines:

- If the awardees point of contact changes anytime during the grant program, the awardee must notify the IDOH within 5 business days after the change and provide the contact information for the new point of contact.
- Awardees must submit data through the Coroner Case Management System.
- Funds awarded as part of this grant opportunity cannot be used to supplant funds for existing programs. Awarded grant funds may only be used to start or expand the programs proposed. If your organization does not abide by this, IDOH reserves the right to revoke funding



Reporting Requirements:

Award recipients will be required to submit overdose and violent death cases through the Indiana Coroner Case Management System. Failure to submit the required reports will be deemed a breach of the grant agreement and will be terminated. IDOH shall suspend or cancel the remaining supplies.

The cases will be required to be entered into the Coroner Case Management System within two months of the date of death.

Service Delivery Dates:

The services requested will be implemented during the proposed period of July 6, 2022 through September 30, 2022. Failure to comply with all terms of this grant by an awardee will halt any future unshipped supplies.

Failure to comply includes:

- Not submitting required reports through the Indiana Coroner Case Management System within the required time period.
- Reports having an average of 75% or less validation in the Indiana Coroner Case Management System.
- Selling the supplies instead of using them as outlined in the application.

Written Proposal Requirements:

The IDOH has created a template that counties can use for their application. The template is optional. Please submit the following to indianatrauma@isdh.in.gov :

- 1) A document with:
 - a. Name, title, email address and phone number of primary contact.
 - b. Name, title, email address and phone number of secondary contact.
 - c. Information about eligible county, including:
 - i. County Name.
 - ii. Mailing address.
 1. *Please note: mailing address cannot be a PO Box or home address.
The address provided must be a business address where someone will be during the day.
 - iii. Work phone.
 - iv. Cell phone.
 - v. Email address.
 - d. List of supplies requested.
 - e. Express interest in receiving supplies and justification for the requested supplies.



Selection Process:

- 1) Following the application deadline, each proposal will be examined to determine compliance with the format and information requirements specified in the grant opportunity announcement. Incomplete proposals or those that do not fully comply with the requirements stated above will not be considered.
- 2) Proposals will be evaluated based on the criteria outlined and the best overall compatibility with the intent of the grant opportunity announcement. Additional evaluative weight will be assigned based on:
 - a. Any other criteria set out in the grant opportunity announcement or otherwise reasonable and considered relevant.

Delivery of the Supplies:

Once the coroner's application has been approved, supplies will be ordered through the state's procurement process and sent to the coroner's office.

- Drug poisoning death counts are pulled by county of occurrence using the underlying cause of death codes X40-X44, X60-X64, X85 or Y10-Y14
- State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS)
