1. Welcome and Introductions

2. 2022 PI Goals

- a. The goal to work with District leadership for PI process improvement has not been addressed very much this year.
- b. More discussion about 2023 PI goals to come in the next meeting, after the ACS consultation visit.

3. Transfer Delays

- a. The reasons for transfer delay don't always align with the data entry options on the trauma registry. A list of updated options was displayed and discussed during this meeting, which took previous discussions into consideration.
- b. Continued education may be necessary to encourage people to fill this field out accurately.
- c. A suggested edit to the language: change "refuses" to "declines" so the option seems less argumentative.

4. Trauma Registry Non-Reporting Hospital Letter

- a. A letter that will be sent to hospitals that have not submitted their trauma data after the reporting period has closed. This letter was put forth by Dr. Weaver, and this letter will be sent out as soon as the close of the Q2 reporting period.
- b. Feedback from Christine Claborn reorganize the letter by moving the paragraph addressing non-reporting's impact on trauma designation earlier in the letter.

5. Continued EMS run sheet collection

 - Sarah Hoeppner from Parkview brought up feedback from her colleague, Lisa. She suggested to investigate whether transfer-outs are being triaged to the appropriate level of care in next year's PI goals.

 - i. Brian Busching noted that there is limited capacity to focus on various topics, but this issue has been noted and will continue to be addressed from a quality improvement perspective.
