

The term for Patricia Gibbs expires at the end of 2013 and after serving 35 years she requested not to be re-appointed. The Hamilton County Cemetery Commission (HCCC) has recommended that Dottie Young should be appointed in her place. Dottie is a member of the Hamilton County Historical Society since 1973, and currently is its President. She is a Board member of the Noblesville Preservation Alliance and member of the Hamilton County Artist Assn.

A Quiet Title Court Action was entered by the HCCC to obtain ownership of the 47-Greenwood Cemetery. The Court Action was completed and HCCC signed a Quit Claim Deed, giving it to the Hamilton County Board of Commissioners. After obtaining ownership the HCCC received three bids and contracted with 20/20 Excavating to removed trees and brush along the fence line, then clean and seed the area. The work was completed and payment made on November 6th.

A Quiet Title Court Action was entered by the HCCC to obtain ownership of the 91-Burk Cemetery. The Court Action was completed and HCCC signed a Quit Claim Deed, giving it to the Hamilton County Board of Commissioners.

A Quiet Title Court Action was entered by the HCCC to obtain ownership of the 64-Weaver Cemetery. The Court Action was completed and HCCC signed a Quit Claim Deed, giving it to the Hamilton County Board of Commissioners.

A Quiet Title Court Action was entered by the HCCC to obtain ownership of the 41-Strawtown Cemetery. The Court Action was completed and HCCC signed a Quit Claim Deed, giving it to the Hamilton County Board of Commissioners.

The 72-Lennen Cemetery has changed ownership and the new owners have given the HCCC permission to again have access and care for it. They opened a way through their crops to get to the cemetery and it was mowed 4 times this year.

33-Busher Cemetery – On 14 December 1863 John Busher signed a deed giving 1.5 acres to John Henry Lewis, Bishop of the Fort Wayne Roman Catholic Church. Later on 16 December 1922 the Bishop of Fort Wayne signed a deed giving 1.5 acres, except a strip now used as a private cemetery to Cardon S. Hunter of Hamilton County. Since the cemetery is currently owned by the Catholic Archdiocese and they have indicated they are willing to give it to the HCCC, Attorney Darren Murphy is drawing up a Quit Claim Deed for them to sign.

Marion Hensley and Robert Goode attended two Indiana DNR/Historical Society Advanced Cemetery Preservation Workshops.


