

Frequently Asked Questions about the Standardbred Breed Development Program:

Question: If my mare is not confirmed in foal by August 1st do I still have to register her by August 1st?

Answer: Yes, you still need to register & have your mare in the State of Indiana by August 1st regardless of whether you have confirmed that she is in foal. However, once your mare is or is not confirmed in foal, please contact our office via phone, email or fax & update us on her status.

Question: If I sell my mare at a sale, does the new owner have to do anything?

Answer: Yes, the new owner needs to re-register the mare under the new ownership and bring her back into the State of Indiana within fourteen (14) days of the sale. It would also be a good idea for the seller to advertise at the sale (perhaps in conjunction with the auctioneer and/or sale catalog) that the mare needs to be re-registered & return to Indiana in order for her foal to remain Indiana Sired & Bred (ISB) or Indiana Bred (IB) eligible. In addition, you are required to notify the IHRC that you will be taking your mare to a sale prior to leaving the State.

Question: If I sell my mare in a private sale, does the new owner have to do anything?

Answer: Yes, you need to notify the IHRC that the mare was sold. The new owner needs to re-register the mare under the new ownership within fourteen (14) days of the sale in order for the mare's foal to remain Indiana Sired & Bred (ISB) or Indiana Bred (IB) eligible. The mare may **at no time** be removed from the State of Indiana from August 1st through the time of foaling. It would be helpful if the seller would inform the buyer of this requirement.

Question: If I move my mare from one farm in Indiana to another farm in Indiana, do I need to do anything?

Answer: Yes, you need to notify the IHRC ANY time you move your mare's location. This allows the inspectors to have the most accurate & up-to-date information. Failure to notify the IHRC of movement may result in your mare's registration being revoked.

Question: What do I need to do if my mare needs medical attention outside of the State of Indiana?

Answer: You must notify the IHRC in writing (via email, fax or mail) and provide proper documentation within 72 hours of when the mare left the State of Indiana for medical treatment.

Question: Do I have to register my mare every year?

Answer: Yes, mare registrations are to be done annually by August 1st. If you want to have an Indiana Sired & Bred (ISB) or an Indiana Bred (IB) foal, you need to re-register your mare on or before August 1st each year, prior to the year the mare will be foaling.

Question: Do I have to register the foal even if the mare was registered?

Answer: Yes, you need to register the foal within thirty (30) days of the foaling date. There is a late fee of \$200 if the foal is not registered within thirty (30) days of the foaling date. Late registrations will only be accepted up until December 31st of the foal's weanling year. After January 1st of the yearling year, the foal is not eligible to be registered.

Question: When do I need to register my foal?

Answer: You need to register your foal within thirty (30) days of the foaling date. Late registrations will be assessed at \$200 late fee.

Question: I forgot to register my foal as a weanling. Can I register as a yearling?

Answer: No, foals can only be registered up until December 31st of the foal's weanling year. After January 1st of the yearling year, the foal is not eligible to be registered.

Question: If my mare was NOT registered the year the foal was conceived, do I need to register the foal?

Answer: No, if your mare was not registered with the IHRC the year the foal was conceived, then you will have an Indiana Sired (IS) Foal, NOT an Indiana Sired & Bred (ISB) Foal. Only Indiana Sired & Bred (ISB) Foals need to be registered with the IHRC.

Question: If I don't register my mare with the IHRC & have her in the State by August 1st, can I register her late?

Answer: No, late registrations are not accepted.

Question: If I don't register my mare & have her in the State of Indiana by August 1st, what is my foal eligible to?

Answer: Your foal will be eligible to all Indiana Sired Events, except for: THE FAIR CIRCUIT, BONUSES & BREEDER'S AWARDS. (See eligibility chart)

Question: If my foal has not been inspected in 30 days after foaling, can I leave the State of Indiana with my foal?

Answer: Yes, if after 30 days, your foal has not been inspected by an IHRC inspector, the foal is allowed to leave the State of Indiana.

Question: If my foal has been inspected within 30 days of foaling, can the foal leave the State of Indiana?

Answer: Yes, if the foal has been inspected by an IHRC inspector within 30 days of foaling, the foal is allowed to leave the State of Indiana.
