



Program at a Glance

Welcome to the Indiana Standardbred Breed Development Program! You are about to be a part of one of the most lucrative breeding programs in the nation. Here is an introduction to our multi-faceted racing programs for your Indiana-Sired or Indiana-Sired and -Bred Standardbred.



Eligible To:

- ▶ Indiana Sire Stakes
- ▶ Indiana Sired Late Closers
- ▶ Mini Series
- ▶ Indiana Sired Overnights
- ▶ Elkhart County Classic
- ▶ Maple City Trot

Requirements:

- ❑ Must be sired by a stallion standing in Indiana that was registered with the Indiana Horse Racing Commission the year the foal was conceived.
- ❑ Must make nomination payments as required for events listed above.



Eligible To:

- ▶ Indiana Sire Stakes
- ▶ Indiana Sired Late Closers
- ▶ Mini Series
- ▶ Indiana Sired Overnights
- ▶ Elkhart County Classic
- ▶ Maple City Trot
- ▶ **ISA Elite Series**
- ▶ **Indiana Sired Fair Circuit**
- ▶ **Breeder's Awards**

Requirements:

- ❑ Mare (Dam) of foal must be registered with the Indiana Horse Racing Commission (IHRC) by August 1 of the breeding season and reside in Indiana from this date until 30 days after foaling.
- ❑ Must be sired by a stallion standing in Indiana that was registered with the IHRC the year the foal was conceived.
- ❑ Foal must be registered with IHRC within 30 days of foaling. *(Late registration is available for foals after 30 days through December 31st of foaling year.)*
- ❑ Must make nomination payments as required for events listed above.

Standing A Stallion in Indiana

- ❑ **October 1** – Stallion must enter Indiana by *October 1* in the year prior to breeding season and submit an annual registration fee of \$150. Stallions must remain in Indiana for the entire breeding season (*February 15 through July 15*). A late fee of \$250 will be assessed for late registration, for a total registration fee of \$400, for any returning stallion. The late fee (\$250) is waived for new stallions standing their first season in Indiana.
- ❑ Stallions arriving late cannot have covered any mares in another state during the same year.
- ❑ An application must be filed every year the stallion breeds in the state of Indiana.
