
#### Militia Records from the Vault

#### Abbreviations and explanations

- 1. Date column.
  - (a) Date indicates date of commission or date of letter, if there is no conflict of dates.
  - (b) If date of commission differs from date of letter, then the date of the letter will appear in brackets. For example: 5-1-1811 date of commission [5-11-1811] date of letter
- 2. Names
  - (a) Names appear as spelled eg. William Jones, Wm Smith, Thomas Jones, Thos. Smith note: I always use John for Jno., also standard abbreviations such as "Benj." for Benj, etc.
  - (b) When the first name is misspelled, I put it down as it appears and put the correct spelling after it in brackets, thus:

    Joshuway [Joshua] Jones
  - (c) When a last name is doubtful, it appears here as: John Right [Wright?]
  - (d) John Jones [?] (It looks like Jones to me).
- 3. Rank.
  - (a) I use standard abbreviations Pvt., Corp., Sgt., Ens., Lieut., Capt., Maj., Lt. Col., Col., Q.M., etc.
  - (b) Where rank is not given a [?] is used.
  - (c) Many letters are signed by petitioners. When I believe that these are members of a militia company, I indicate rank as Pvt [?].
- 4. Unit.
  - (a) Unit is given as completely as possible (company, Battalion, Regts., etc).
  - (b) Standard abbreviations used:
    Co for Company, Bn for Battalion, Regt. for Regiment, etc.
  - (c) Where a unit is not identified I try to describe it:
    Franklin County militia, a rifle company, etc.
- 5. Remarks:
  - (a) Commissioned: (When actual commission is given).
  - (b) Recommended: (When a man is recommended for a commission or promotion)
  - (c) Signature: Document signed by a person evidently in the Militia.
  - (d) Petition Signature: a petition signed by a person who is probably a member of the militia.
  - (e) elected: Reported elections of officers (no statement that commissions were actually issued).
