
A Finding Aid for the Holdings of the Indiana State Archives.

After the Civil War the Soldiers and Sailors Home and the Soldiers and Sailors Children's Home were also established. By the turn of the century additional facilities had been created for Epileptic and "Feeble Minded" patients.

In 1870 a special "State Census for the Insane" was conducted for the purpose of identifying those citizens who were in need of further help, and to develop a plan to create facilities that would care for them or train them to care for themselves.

Indiana's beneficence did not come cheaply as the chart below illustrates.

In 1880 a special census was added to the Federal Census to identify the Defective, Delinquent, and Dependent classes.

By 1889 a Board of State Charities and Correction had been established to oversee all institutions.

-PURPOSE: The supervision of the whole system of public charities of the State.

Duties:

- -To see that every inmate of every public institution receives proper care.
- -To see that the public funds are properly expended.
- -To see that the institutions are properly conducted.
- -To see that the management is protected from unjust criticism.

A new movement known as Eugenics, meaning "well born", appeared to offer the solution to the high cost of maintenance for Indiana's state patients and inmates. The BSC had recorded the family history of anyone coming under state care for a number of years and had observed that certain genetic traits could be passed on from parent to child. In debates of heredity versus environment, the latter was acknowledged as a major influence, but hardly the

NOTES ON INDIANA STERILIZATION LAWS

1907 House Bill 364 (Approved March 9, 1907)

AN ACT entitled an act to prevent procreation of confirmed criminals, idiots, imbeciles and rapists: providing that superintendents and boards of managers of institutions where such persons are confined shall have the authority and are empowered to appoint a committee of experts, consisting of two (2) physicians, to examine into the mental condition of such inmates.

The language of this bill could easily be interpreted to apply to all state institutions. The heading after the preamble reads, Penal Institutions- Surgical Operations. The text, however, states "...it shall be compulsory for each and every institution in the state, entrusted with the care of confirmed criminals, idiots, rapists and imbeciles, to appoint upon its staff, ... (2) skilled surgeons of recognized ability, whose duty it shall be, ... to examine the mental and physical condition of such inmates..."

It does not appear that any other state agency besides the Indiana State Reformatory and possibly the State Prison made an attempt to take advantage of this law. Dr. Harry C. Sharp, head of the medical department at the Reformatory, had been performing vasectomies since 1899. In the 1905-1906 Biennial Report, sharp reported, "In the past two years I have performed thirty vasectomies making 206 in all." In 1907 an additional 21 sterilizations were done. The following year 119 inmates received vasectomies.

Governor J. Frank Hanley cautioned Superintendent Walker to follow the recommendations of the Committee on Penal and Reformatory Institutions. The chairman of the committee, Demarchus C. Brown, wrote, "There is danger of arousing public sentiment against this law, which we believe to be a wise one if properly handled, and of having it repealed or declared to be unconstitutional through its unwise administration." In his reply Whitaker agreed not to perform the procedure on "inmates of this institution except those who have been sentenced since the passage of the sterilization law." He agreed to be very cautious in selecting candidates for the surgery. Thirty operations were done in 1909, ten in 1910, and four in 1912.

In January 1909, William O'Keefe, a Plymouth, Indiana business man wrote to Governor Thomas R. Marshall with an "appeal to stop the brutal mutilation of the inmates of the Indiana State Institutions." O'Keefe pointed out that more than 200 operations had been performed before the law was passed. He dismissed Dr. Sharp's claims to have the written consent of the patients. "It is an easy matter to get the consent of a man when you have him in your power from two to fourteen years. The burglar often gets the consent of a man to take his money by holding a lighted torch to his feet." O'Keefe said the law was "only equaled in viciousness by rape itself."

In the 1921 Indiana State Supreme Court case, Williams et al. V. Smith, the 1907 sterilization law was declared unconstitutional. According to the ruling, inmates did not have "opportunity for a hearing or to cross-examine the experts who decided upon the operation, or to establish that he was not within the class designated in the statute." In effect, the inmates were denied due process of law. This is a direct violation of the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
