# Sugar Creek Scenic River Designation and other DNR Files 1985-2001; 2004 Finding Aid

#### Biographical/Historical Note:

In 1997, the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) attempted to redesignate the Sugar Creek River as a "scenic river." This redesignation would allow the DNR to manage and conserve the river for public use. Those in favor of the redesignation complained that pollution and sewage was often dumped into the river and the littering problem around the riverbanks. They hoped the redesignation would make the State of Indiana maintain the river while also building features for activities like canoeing, hiking, and fishing. There was a much larger negative reaction from homeowners and private landowners who owned land along the river. Due to the river not being treated as a public utility, many parcels of land included sections of the river as a part of their deed. As a result, hundreds of people and landowners participated in a letter writing campaign and signed a petition to prevent the redesignation in fear of eminent domain being used to seize parts of their property. Landowners also feared that increased visitation to Sugar Creek could result in increased crime and littering.

The State Park division of the DNR began in 1916, with the help of Colonel Richard Lieber, who went on to establish state parks in other states. Lieber was a proponent of all state parks should charge small fees to allow themselves to be more self-sufficient and this practice is carried on today, with Indiana's State Park system leading in self-sufficiency.

# Scope and Content Note:

This accession pertains to a 1997 attempt to redesignate the Sugar Creek into a "scenic river." These records include DNR studies on the plant and wildlife in the Sugar Creek area. Other records document community outreach efforts about the redesignation, including correspondence, memos, photos, minutes, newspaper clippings, negatives, projector slides, etc.

Records in this collection also includes miscellaneous agency records. These include brochures for hiking, bicycling, and snowmobiling. Additionally, there are maps that are associated with each type of trail. Also included are lease and contract agreements with private landowners who provided their land to be a part of the snowmobile trails from December through April each year. Oversized folders contain planning maps of different routes that were added to or expanded. There are slides of Walnut Creek and a cleanup operation being done at Wildcat Creek. There are examples of signage the DNR utilized on their bicycling and snowmobiling routes.

## Arrangement:

Record Series 1: Sugar Creek Scenic River Designation. These records primarily detail internal documents inside of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (DNR) pertaining to different studies, memoranda, and email communications about the river designation. There are some maps in oversized that go with this series.

Record Series 2 are folders pertaining to the public perception and reaction to the DNR's attempted redesignation of Sugar Creek. The primary documents include a letter writing campaign against the redesignation citing fears of imminent domain and crowds of tourists ruining individual's private property located along the riverbank.

Record Series 3 are the various brochures and other public-facing information sheets the DNR used to

talk to the public about snowmobiling, bicycling, canoeing, and hiking. Included in this series are signage artifacts.

Record Series 4 is about various programs for conservation of various rivers that the DNR generated between the 1980s-2000s. The majority of the records pertain to the Wabash River Heritage Corridor and its various iterations. This series also contains projector slides.

Record Series 5 contains miscellaneous documents.
