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Conrad Baker Papers

The papers of Conrad Baker (1817-1885), colonel in the Civil War, lieutenant governor of Indiana (1865-1867), governor (1867-1873), and distinguished lawyer, were given to the Society in 1963. The collection dates between 1858 and 1886 and is contained in 24 volumes and 16 manuscript boxes. Perhaps most important are the letter books, four for the period of Baker's term as lieutenant governor, seventeen for the period of his governorship, and three private letter books, 1868-1871. The collection also includes some 70 letters and telegrams to and from Oliver P. Morton and other items pertaining to Morton, mostly political. There are also letters from Horace P. Biddle, Henry P. Carrington, John Coburn, Schuyler Colfax, William H. English, John W. Foster, Walter Q. Gresham, Rutherford B. Hayes, Thomas A. Hendricks, Joseph I. Irwin, J. F. D. Lanier, Godlove S. Papers of the law firm of Baker, Hord and Hendricks (Conrad Baker, Oscar B. Hord, and Thomas Hendricks), covering the period from 1863 to 1886, include material on cases relating to the Grand Prairie Harmonial Institute, a communal association, the Central Union Telephone Company, and the Wabash, St. Louis and Pacific Railroad.

With the gift of the Conrad Baker papers we also received the papers of Charles G. McLean, a Presbyterian minister of Indianapolis, and his family.

Noble Chase Butler Papers

The Noble Chase Butler papers, still largely unprocessed, were given to the Library in 1959. They range in date from 1844 to 1904 and are presently stored in 34 temporary boxes. The collection comprises papers relating to Noble Chase
