3. Container D shall contain all correspondence, papers and statements relating to Dissolution proceedings. All material found in the Welsh papers that relate directly to the Dissolution proceedings shall be transferred to Container D. Container D shall not be open to researchers until May 1, 2045.

DESCRIPTION OF GIFT: Approximately ten (10) boxes of papers of former Governor Matthew E. Welsh maintained at his law office (Bingham, Summers, Welsh, and Spilman). In order to ensure preservation for future generations, the Welsh papers will be microfilmed and then made available to scholars researching the history of the Welsh administration, or other related Indiana history topics. These papers will be added to the State Archives collection of records originating from Governor Welsh's administration and his career in Indiana government. This collection will be closed to researchers until 2-15-2005.

Exception to the above: During the five (5) years following the signing of this deed of gift, the Governor's two (2) daughters, Kathryn and Janet Welsh, may each request the return of two (2) original letters or documents and/or copies of fifty (50) letters or documents, without charge. The requests must be in writing and signed by the Governor's daughter. Also, each daughter may request in writing a free copy of one (1) roll of microfilm of this collection.

The Commission on Public Records recently removed Governor Welsh's private collections from his house (since he was moving to an apartment), including furniture and artifacts, papers from his period as Governor, and some of his private library. It was Governor's Welsh's wish that these materials be given to appropriate state institutions, including the State Museum, the State Library and the State Archives. Since the move was somewhat difficult for him, he asked that the Commission remove all items and deliver them to the proper institutions.

Attached please find a list of all the books, pamphlets and miscellaneous visual materials found in the boxes we removed from his house. Several of the books were given to Governor Welsh and were inscribed by their donor; many were books that he simply enjoyed or used later in his post-government work or investment pursuits.

The State Archives would like to transfer these materials to the State Library per Governor Welsh's request. When you have a minute, please review the list. I would like to set up a time when you can view the books, if you would like, and make any decisions you need. I suspect we will return any unwanted materials to the family.

In order to make an inventory of Governor Welsh's collection, I would like you to gather the following information:

- I. ITEM -- Give a one or two-word item name, such as:
  - Painting
  - Photograph
  - Campaign hat
  - Campaign banner
  - Campaign ribbon
  - Plaque
  - Trophy
  - Flag
  - Book

You're going to find some odd items here, such as a football, a baton, and a horn (looks like it might have been a Christmas ornament). You'll also find things you may not know what they are. Put them aside and we'll look at them later together. We may not be able to come up with any logical item name, and call the darned thing "Unidentified."

- II. SIZE -- Use a ruler or tape measure to give me approximate dimensions, either the two dimensions, or three dimensions in the case of an artifact. For example:

Painting:	36" x 48"
Photograph:	4" x 5"
Campaign Hat:	10" x 8" x 3 1/2" (tall)
Campaign banner:	12" x 36"

Campaign ribbon:	2" x 5"
Plaque:	10" x 12"
Trophy:	8" x 5" x 24" (tall)
Flag:	36" x 54"
Book:	8" x 11"

III. WRITTEN OR PRINTED TEXT -- Write down if there is anything handwritten or printed on the item that helps identify it. For example:

Painting: Signed in lower right corner by the artist, Vincent Van Gogh

OR

Photograph: Metal plaque on frame reading "Given to Gov. Welsh by the artist, Vincent Van Gogh and his Family, Aug. 1, 1973."  
On back of photo handwritten note "Welsh Family at Fund Raiser, Feb 3, 1972."

Campaign hat: Printed on hat reads "Matt '72."

Camp. banner: Printed on banner "Matt Welsh in '72."

Camp. ribbon: Printed on ribbon "Matt '72" and includes a picture of the Governor's face.

Plaque: Engraved metal plate reads "In honor of Governor and Mrs Welsh for their donation of \$1,000 to the American Cancer Society."

Trophy: Engraved metal plate on base reads "Mrs. Matthew Welsh. Outstanding Volunteer. Crossroads Rehabilitation Center. 1963."

IV. MEDIUM -- Try to determine what the item is made with or of, or what characteristics it has, such as:

Painting:	Oil, watercolor
Drawing:	Pencil
Photograph:	Don't need to say anything here, except to mention either black and white or color.
Campaign hat:	Styrofoam
Camp. banner:	Paper (or, cloth)
Camp. ribbon:	Silk (or, cotton, or satin)
Plaque:	Wood with metal plates
Trophy:	Wood base with metal trophy (or, with plastic

trophy)  
Flag: Nylon (or, linen, cotton)

Do your best to try to tell. If you're in doubt, put a question mark down by it and we'll review it together.

V. MISCELLANEOUS NOTES -- Put down any additional information that you think important to tell, or any other description that would help identify the item, like "Medal inside a small clam-shell, velvet case," OR "Horn probably used for Christmas decoration." Other helpful information would be if the painting or drawing is in a frame, if the photograph is framed and behind glass, if the campaign ribbon has been framed, etc.

As I said, do the best you can. Set aside the items you are really puzzled about and we'll go over it. As for the books, magazines, newspapers, etc.--catalog everything. We may end up taking some items off the list eventually--because we have decided to keep it, throw it away, or give it back to the family--and not transfer it to the State Museum.

You can do the inventory either on a pad of paper, and type it up later, or if you want to set some chart up on your computer--or on a diskette and use the lap-top if you want. It's up to you! GOOD LUCK!
