**IMAGES & LOGOS:** PDF or Vector

**\*NOTE:** Vector are usually comes as .pdf, .ai, .eps. Just because a file is .pdf, ai, or .eps does not mean it's vector though. You can embed raster elements in any of those files formats. The easiest way to tell if something is vector is to just open it in Acrobat and zoom in. If everything looks smooth when you zoom in all the way then it's vector.
