EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ICW recognizes the importance of moving Indiana women forward by continuing to prioritize partnering with other entities to develop, assist, and promote programs and services to address the needs of Hoosier women and girls. Our strategic plan has been to devote efforts to infant and maternal health, assess affordable and quality childcare in Indiana, and support emerging and current women leaders.

In January 2023, the Indiana University School of Medicine - National Center of Excellence in Women's Health, the American Medical Women's Association (AMWA), and the Global Initiative Against HPV and Cervical Cancer invited ICW to create the second promotional video for their annual Us vs HPV webinar series. This week-long webinar took place from January 22-25 to bring awareness about HPV and HPV-related diseases.





For years the Indiana Department of Correction's Breann Leath Maternal Child Heath Unit (MCHU) sought support to implement a doula program for the mothers and babies at the facility. As part of ICW's commitment to infant and maternal health, sponsoring the doula program was the first mission to support the mothers most overlooked by society. In March 2022, the program was implemented into action, and the first two births occurred on February 15 and February 17, 2023, with the doulas.

In March 2023, we had an action-packed month in celebration of Women's History Month. In partnership with the Indiana Historical Bureau, we showcased each day the historical accomplishments of the Indiana women who've contributed to Indiana's history and progression. On March 8, we hosted a fourpart panel on how women can learn, lead, leap, and lift each other for International Women's Day. Then on March 14, we hosted seven Indianapolis schools at the Indiana Statehouse to present their community service projects during the legislative session. Furthermore, the AMWA, invited ICW to collaborate on the first-ever promotional video for their 108th anniversary and annual meeting from March 23-26, 2023.

Next, on September 27, 2023, we celebrated seven phenomenal women for their outstanding achievements to their community, state, and nation at the Indiana Historical Society.

Lastly, in December we presented a statewide campaign and virtual seminar in collaboration with the Indiana Department of Health's Maternal and Child Health Division. The seminar focused on breaking barriers within maternal health communications and featured five of Indiana's maternal and child healthcare professions.

ICW is honored to share our initiatives this year alongside our partners and value the opportunity to continue serving the State of Indiana!





Mission

The Indiana Commission for Women (ICW) exists to voice women's needs, concerns, and challenges; as well as celebrate their successes and contributions to Indiana.





Organization

The Commission consists of fifteen members appointed by the Governor (7), the Speaker of the House of Representatives (2), the Senate President Pro Tempore (2), and the Indiana General Assembly (4). The Director provides support to the Commission [IC 4-23-25-3].

ICW is one of the State of Indiana's five cultural commissions housed under the umbrella of the Indiana Civil Rights Commission to provide education, resources, and initiatives for Indiana's minority, underrepresented, and ethnically diverse communities.

Core Values

Identifying and recognizing the contributions made by Indiana women to their community, state, and nation.

Collaborating with other governmental agencies and outside organizations to assess the needs of women in all aspects of society, and combat discrimination of women.

Working for the advocacy of removing legal and social barriers for women.



OUR alule IC 4-23-25-7

Pursuant to IC 4-23-25-7, the following are listed as the Commission's duties:

(1) Assessment of the needs of Indiana women and their families and promotion of the full participation of Indiana women in all aspects of society, including:

- (A) government;
- (B) the economy;
- (C) employment;
- (D) education;

(E) social and family development; (F) health care;

(G) the justice system; and (H) other aspects of society identified by the commission.

(2) Advocacy for the removal of legal and social barriers for women.

(3) Cooperation with organizations and governmental agencies to combat discrimination against women.

(4) Identification and recognition of contributions made by Indiana women to their community, state, and nation.

(5) Representation of Indiana's commitment to improving the quality of life for women and their families.

(6) Consultation with state agencies regarding the effect upon women and their families of agency policies, emerging policies, procedures, practices, laws, and administrative rules.

(7) Maintenance of information concerning:

(A) organizations and governmental agencies serving women and their families: and

(B) the names, resumes, and other professional and career information about women available to serve as agency appointees.

(8) Evaluation of laws and governmental policies with respect to the needs of women and their families.

(9) Monitoring of legislation and other legal developments in order to make recommendations that support the commission's purposes to the general assembly and the governor.

(10) Action as a central clearinghouse for information concerning women and their families.

(11) Gathering, studying, and disseminating information on women and their families through publications, public hearings, conferences, and other means.

(12) Assessment of the needs of women and their families and the promotion of, development of, and assistance to other entities in providing programs and services to meet those needs.

(13) Provision of publicity concerning the purposes and activities of the commission.

(14) Service as a liaison between government and private interest groups concerned with serving the special needs of women.

(15) Submission of an annual report on the commission's activities to the governor and to the legislative council. An annual report submitted to the legislative council must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.



ICW PROMOTIONAL VIDEOS

January 2023

Each year the Indiana University School of Medicine – National Center of Excellence in Women's Health, the AMWA, and the Global Initiative Against HPV and Cervical Cancer host the US vs. HPV webinar series. This webinar took place from January 22-25 and is intended for healthcare providers, parents, patients, community leaders, women health advocates, students, young leaders, and public members.

Each day featured a 1-hour live panel discussion on various topics related to HPV and HPV-related diseases. This is the second year in a row the organizations have invited ICW to be a promotional sponsor by designing a promotional video to encourage participation and registrations.

Due to the success of the promotional video for the US vs. HPV webinar series, the AMWA invited us to collaborate on the first-ever promotional video for its 108th annual meeting in conjunction with the Medical Women's International Association North American Congress.

AMWA's annual meetings aim to bring together women physicians and women healthcare entrepreneurs from across the nation to advance women in medicine, advocate for equity, and ensure excellence in healthcare.
