Primary and secondary lead standards were established on September 28, 1978 at a level of 1.5 micrograms per cubic meter ( $\text{ug}/\text{m}^3$ ) ([43 FR 46246](#)). All other areas of Indiana not listed above were designated attainment/unclassifiable under the 1978 annual lead standard.

Attainment of the 1978 annual lead standard was determined by evaluating each calendar quarter arithmetic average, which must not exceed  $1.5 \text{ ug}/\text{m}^3$  over a three-year period.

U.S. EPA lowered the annual lead standard to a level of  $0.15 \text{ ug}/\text{m}^3$ . The standards were finalized by U.S. EPA on October 15, 2008 and became effective on January 12, 2009 ([73 FR 66964](#)). All areas of Indiana met the 1978 lead standard at the time it was replaced with the annual 2008 lead standard.
