

On August 28, 2020, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) Solid Waste Permits Section received an application for a renewal of a Nonsite-Specific Biosolids and Industrial Waste Products Land Application Permit from Wealing Brothers, LLC at 4161 North 600 East, Fowler, IN. The application is a request to continue accepting biosolids and/or industrial waste products for blending at their facility located in Benton County. The application also requests to continue land applying blends containing biosolids and/or industrial waste products at agronomic rates to farmland in Benton, Jasper, and White Counties. The notice will provide details on how you may appeal IDEM's decision, if you disagree with that decision.
