To all interested parties: This letter shall serve as a formal notice of the receipt of an application for a **State Isolated Wetland Individual Permit** by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM). The purpose of the notice is to inform the public of active applications submitted for permits required under IC 13-18-22 and to solicit comments and information on any impacts to water quality related to the proposed project. IDEM will evaluate whether the project complies with Indiana's water quality standards as set forth at 327 IAC 2 and all applicable provisions of IC 13-18-22.

5. Project Description: Applying for an After-the-Fact permit for clearing and grading 1.755 acres of Wetland C for the construction of a

multi-purpose retail, hospitality, commercial, and professional services development. Associated roadways and utilities will be installed for this development. Previous project impacts have been permitted in phases (2022-

895-17-EJW-A and 2022-464-17-WLR-A).

Comment period: Any person or entity who wishes to submit comments or information relevant to the aforementioned project may

do so by the closing date noted above. Only comments or information related to water quality or potential impacts of the project on water quality can be considered by IDEM in the state isolated wetland permit review

process.

Public Hearing: Any person may submit a written request that a public hearing be held to consider issues related to water quality

in connection with the project detailed in this notice. The request for a hearing should be submitted within the comment period to be considered timely. The request should also state the reason for the public hearing as

specifically as possible to assist IDEM in determining whether a public hearing is warranted.

Auburn Retail, LLC (Applicant) has been in the process of constructing "Auburn Crossing", a mixed-use commercial development project located at the northeast corner of the intersection of W. Seventh Street and Interstate 69 in Auburn, DeKalb County, Indiana, which is hereinafter referred to as the "Project Site". Applicant intends to proceed with a third permitting phase for the project; "Phase 3" is located north of Phases "1" and "2".

The Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) issued an Isolated Wetland Individual Permit (IWIP) on August, 4, 2022 (Permit No. 2022-464-17-WLR-A), which authorized 0.045 acre of isolated wetland impact to Wetland C (a non-exempt, Class II isolated wetland) within Phase 1. IDEM then issued a second IWIP (IWIP 2022-905-17-EJW) for Phase 2 that authorized an additional 3.426 acres of impact to Wetland C.

When construction of Phase 2 began, land grubbing activity (removal of woody vegetation and stumps) occurred northward beyond Phase 2, resulting in an additional 1.755 acres of impact to Wetland C, which was not authorized under the aforementioned IWIPs. Applicant requests "after-the-fact" (ATF) authorization for the unauthorized impact to Wetland C. During the land grubbing, isolated, exempt Wetlands A and B were also impacted.

nulnventa is submitting the enclosed application on behalf of Applicant who is requesting ATF authorization for 1.755 acre of impact to Wetland C; and, attached to the application you will find the following two maps, listed below, that graphically show the location of Phase 3. This third permitting phase and the north one-third portion of permitting Phase 2 are together referred to as the "Project Site - Lot 7"; the wetland impact area for which ATF authorization is requested is shown in **Figure A**, attached. The purpose of this permitting phase is to create a building pad suitable to construct a multi-story hotel on Lot 7

- **Figure 1**, **Project Site Location Map**, which depicts the location of the Project Site within the northeast Indiana Region and the City of Auburn.
- Under the Public Land Survey System, the Project Site is located in parts of the following quarter-sections, townships, and ranges, which are also shown in **Figure 2**, **USGS 7.5-Minute Topographic Map, Auburn & Waterloo Quadrangles**:
 - o E ½; SE ¼; SE ¼; Section 25; Township 34 North; Range 12 East
 - o SW ¼; SW ¼; Section 30; Township 34 North; Range 13 East

A wetland delineation was completed in October 2019 and January 2021. The boundaries of delineated wetlands were modified during a site visit with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE); and subsequently, the USACE issued an Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) dated May 3, 2021 that states all wetlands identified on the Project Site are non-jurisdictional. The IDEM issued a Water of the State (WOTS) Determination letter dated December 2, 2021. Because nulnventa submitted copies of the original wetland delineation report and the AJD and WOTS Determination letters in the IWIP application submission for Phase 1, they are not included with this submittal; however, if your office no longer has these materials, please let me know and I will forward copies to you electronically, via email.

A request was submitted to the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) to review the Natural Heritage Database (NHD) for records of state-listed threatened or endangered species, high-quality natural communities, and natural areas within a one-half mile radius of the Project Site. A response dated November 12, 2021 was received and is enclosed for your review. One record, which is that for the American badger (*Taxidea taxus*), a "state species of special concern". Over the course of completing fieldwork at the Project Site, nuInventa has not encountered this species. The species prefers areas such as prairie regions with sandy loam soils where it can dig more easily for its prey. While some open grassy areas are present on the Project Site, the grass consists of monotypic stands of reed canary grass (*Phalaris arundinacea*) growing in wetlands with heavy clayey soils. Because the preferred habitat of American badger is not present at the Project Site, the project is not expected to adversely affect the species.

The potential impacts the project may have on Indiana bat (*Myotis sodalis*) and northerneared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*) were evaluated. Trees within the limits of Phase 3 of Auburn Crossing were predominantly young to middle-aged eastern cottonwood (*Populus deltoides*), devoid of exfoliating bark. Older cottonwood trees may have deep bark furrows that could potentially harbor these bat species. To avoid impacting these species, trees wee removed from the Project Site after September 30 and before April 1.

To compensate for the loss of wetland functions and values, Applicant proposes to purchase 3.51 acres of forested wetland credits from the Indiana In-Lieu Fee Mitigation Program. This is a proposed mitigation ratio of 2:1.

Note: Some wetland activities may impact both U.S. navigable waters and state regulated isolated wetlands. In those situations, the project will require a Section 401 Water Quality Certification and Section 404 U.S. Corps of Engineers permit AND approval under the new State Isolated Wetland Regulatory Program. When IDEM receives an application that involves an activity that may impact both intrastate navigable waters and a state regulated wetland, current state law requires that we evaluate each activity using different authorities. IDEM will, at the request of an applicant, evaluate a project with multi-jurisdictional wetlands under the Section 401 certification framework and will provide one authorization for the project, applying the state regulated isolated wetlands law and federal Clean Water Act Section 401 authorities. If an applicant prefers that all IDEM approvals occur within one streamlined review process, a separate letter specifically requesting a combined review of the entire project should be submitted concurrently with the application.



Wetlands A, B, and C are Class 2 wetlands with moderate aquatic habitat and hydrology which lie in a disturbed setting. Each wetland is forested with over 30% canopy coverage. Wetlands A and B are Class 2 wetlands in a municipality under 3/4

acre and thus do not require a permit for dredge and fill activities under IC 13-18-22-1(b)(7). Wetland C is a class 2 wetland greater than ¾ acre and will require a permit under IC 13-18-22.
