

On June 25, 2025, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) Solid Waste Permits Section received an application for a Marketing and Distribution Permit from Roann Compost, 5711 West 400 North Wabash, IN 46992. The application is a request to accept food processing waste, manure, spent grain, gypsum wallboard, and other industrial waste products (as approved by the department) as a feedstock for composting at their proposed facility located on the property at 5277 East S.R. 16, Denver, Miami County. The application also requests to market and/or distributed the compost as a soil amendment or substitute for commercial fertilizer.

The application is available online via IDEM's Virtual File Cabinet (VFC). Please go to: <http://vfc.idem.in.gov/>. Documents related to this application can be found by selecting the "Solid Waste Program ID" in the "Quick Search" field (in the upper right-hand corner of the page) then enter the permit number, 000923. Search results can be narrowed to permit related documents by clicking on the down arrow next to "IDEM Document Type" and selecting "OLQ Permit".

You may comment during the public comment period. Comments may be submitted until August 27, 2025. Comments and supporting documentation should be sent in writing to IDEM at the address below. If comments are received during the public notice period, the final decision will include a document that summarizes the comments and IDEM's response to those comments. If you have submitted comments or have asked to be added to the mailing list, you will receive the NOD. The notice will provide details on how you may appeal IDEM's decision if you disagree with that decision. The final decision will also be available online via the Virtual File Cabinet, at the address indicated above.
