Composting with Worms in the Classroom

As students get back into the swing of things in the classrooms, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) encourages educators to schedule a composting program!

Students will learn about worms, how red worms help turn food scraps into compost, and simple ways they can divert the amount of trash sent to landfills. Teachers can request their own small worm compost bin for the classroom, along with maintenance instructions, while supplies last.

Having a classroom compost bin can serve multiple purposes. It can be used as an ongoing instructional tool; the

compost generated from the bin can be used to increase the soil health of class-room plants or school gardens; and it can instill an appreciation of even earth's smallest creatures in students. Craft Corner -

Monarch Butterfly

Every fall Monarch butterflies migrate from east of the Rockies migrate to central Mexico. They travel much farther than any other butterfly, up to 3,000 miles. To learn more about Monarch butterflies, their amazing migration, and how you can participate in tracking their migration visit monarchwatch.org.



Materials Needed:

- 1 coffee filter
- Pipe cleaner
- Water
- Clothespin
- Washable orange and black markers

How to Make a Migrating Monarch Butterfly

- 1. Flatten out the coffee filter.
- 2. Color your coffee filter with washable orange and black markers.
- **3.** Lightly spray water on coffee filter. You can use a spray bottle, eye dropper, or small measuring spoon.
- 4. Place coffee filter on paper towel to dry.
- **5.** Cut a pipe cleaner in half, fold into a "V" for antenna.
- **6.** Once dry, scrunch the coffee filter in the middle, add antenna, and slide the coffee filter and antenna into clothespin.

High School Receives Funding from IDEM's Community Recycling Grant Program

Lawrenceburg High School, in Dearborn County, was awarded \$12,779 through IDEM's Community Recycling Grant Program to create a plastic up-cycling program. This funding will be allocated towards equipment and supplies. As part of this program, students will replace traditional lumber in the wood shop with re-purposed plastic materials. The classroom program focuses on STEM activities, waste reduction, and an introduction to process improvements in plastic panel manufacturing.

Each year, this grant provides funding for recycling projects that focus on education and promotion of recycling, processing of recyclable materials, waste reduction, or composting. Schools, counties, municipalities, solid waste management districts, and nonprofit organizations, in Indiana, are eligible to submit a Community Recycling Grant application. Consider applying in 2024!
