May is American Wetlands Month!

Wetlands provide important ecological services, such as:

- Water filtration, which cleans the water,
- Water storage, which reduces flooding; and
- Critical habitat, on which many endangered species rely.

Since the 1600's, the US has lost roughly 50% of its wetlands. Today, wetlands cover less than 4% of Indiana, compared to 25% in the early 1700s. Educating students on the importance of wetlands is a crucial step in protecting them.

Craft Corner

Make an Ice Suncatcher

Making an ice suncatcher is a fun and easy way to enjoy the winter weather. To get started, go for a hike outside and search for natural treasures – sticks, leaves, rocks, etc. You can also use seeds or fruit. Then, arrange your items in a pan, add water, and freeze. Then you can hang them outside. Don't forget that your ice suncatcher will melt, so be sure to use items that are environmentally friendly.

Instructions:

- **1.** Arrange nature treasures in the container.
- 2. Fill the container with water.
- 3. Add the ribbon halfway into the pan.
- 4. Freeze for four hours or longer.
- 5. Remove the container form the freezer.
- **6.** After 15 minutes, remove the ice suncatcher from the container.
- 7. Hang outside!

For this craft, you will need:

- A container such as a cake pan, ice cube tray, food storage, etc.
- Small rocks, sticks, leaves, seeds, fruit, etc.
- Ribbon or yarn
- Water
- Food coloring (optional)
