### Rule Information Sheet

#### Marion County Sulfur Dioxide Redesignation Emergency Rule

##### Overview

This emergency rule temporarily amends 326 IAC 1-4-50 to update the status of Center, Perry, and Wayne Townships in Marion County from “nonattainment” to “attainment” for the 2010 1-hour primary National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for sulfur dioxide. This rule is in response to a final rule by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) published in the *Federal Register* on May 21, 2020 at 85 FR 30844 that redesignated these townships in Marion County from “nonattainment” to “attainment” for the 2010 1-hour primary NAAQS for sulfur dioxide. This emergency rule was previously adopted by the Environmental Rules Board on July 8, 2020.

##### Affected Persons

Regulated sources in Center, Perry, and Wayne Townships in Marion County that emit sulfur dioxide and are subject to major source permitting requirements will be affected by this rule.

##### Reasons for the Rule

This emergency rule is in response to a final rule published by the U.S. EPA in the *Federal Register* on May 21, 2020, that redesignated Center, Perry, and Wayne townships in Marion County from “nonattainment” to “attainment” for the 2010 1-hour primary NAAQS for sulfur dioxide.

##### Economic Impact of the Rule

This rule has no economic impact.
