Environmental Stewardship Program

- ESP is a free, voluntary, performance-based leadership program designed to recognize and reward Indiana regulated entities for going above and beyond compliance with current environmental regulations.
- The program began in 2006 funded under a U.S. Environmental Protection Pollution Prevention Grant awarded to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management. The goal was to mirror the U.S. EPA National Environmental Performance Track program.
- This program continues today under the Office of Program Support.

Nitrogen Oxide (NOx)	58 pounds reduced

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2017 ESP Member Achievements

- ❖ Water Use = 225 Olympic sized swimming pools
- ❖ Electricity Use = enough to power 790 homes / year
- ❖ Solid Waste sent to Landfill = 12,052 full-sized
passenger trucks
- ❖ Hazardous Materials = 251 African adult elephants
- ❖ Energy Use (Btus)= enough to heat 13 homes / year
