




Base line year & quantities: beginning of reporting calendar year unless it's a long-term project that has not had any prior reporting





ESP Incentives - Update

All member incentives are available to IDEM regulatory offices

- Easy look up for inspection scheduling
- > No more unannounced visits (for those with that incentive)
- Quality check for incentives included in permits

Advanced announcement of routine inspections

- Alternative compliance or monitoring strategies
 - Permit number
 - Possible alternative strategies
- Alternative due date for certain quarterly or semi-annual reports
 - Permit number
 - Type of report and alternative due date
- Exemption from submitting monthly monitoring reports (MMR)
 - Permit number
- Exemption from submitting monthly reports of operation (MRO)
 - Permit number
- Reduction in NPDES permit sampling frequency
 - Permit number
 - Provide suggested frequency:
 - Provide basis for proposed sampling frequency

Reminder: permit modification needed for permit incentives

Rules of Interest

Title V Permitting Fees LSA #23-290 (OAQ) – Final Rule

IDEM has adopted amendments to 326 IAC 2-1.1-7 to increase the base annual fees for federal Title V Permits and Federally Enforceable State Operating Permits (FESOP).

The final amendments will increase the base annual Title V fee from \$2,381 to \$6,100 and increase the annual FESOP fee from \$2,381 to \$6,100.

Effective January 1, 2024





Rules of Interest

Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Certification LSA #18-365 (OWQ) – Final Rule

This rulemaking addresses two state statutory requirements and improves the processes for certifying wastewater treatment plant operators.

The existing rule at 327 IAC 5-22 will be repealed and replaced with 327 IAC 5-23.

- In the new rule, 327 IAC 5-23, proposed clarifications include
 - ➤ definitions,
 - > plant classifications,
 - qualifications and substitution of qualifications,
 - the duties of an operator,
 - > what is considered a passing score for the certification examination, and
 - the removal of specific allowable substitutions for education and experience replacing them with more general criteria for allowable substitutions in 327 IAC 5-23-10.

A non-rule policy document providing guidance and further information on the education and experience substitutions was presented to the board concurrently with this rule.

Why Change to Environmental Sustainability?


Pollution Prevention is STILL a cornerstone for Indiana Partners
