Upcoming Compliance Due Dates

- December 15:
 - Fourth quarter payment due for annual National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) discharge flow fees, if paying in quarterly installments.
- January 15:
 - Quarterly [solid waste facility reports](#) due.
- January 30:
 - Quarterly air Deviation and Compliance Monitoring Report due for October through December.



Upcoming Compliance Due Dates

- January 30:
 - Quarterly air permit reports (e.g., usage reports) due for October through December.
 - Semi-annual air Compliance Monitoring Report due for July through December.
- February 15:
 - Annual [hazardous waste operation fees](#) are due 30 days after the invoice is generated for Large Quantity Generators (LQG) or Treatment, Storage, and Disposal (TSD) facilities disposing, incinerating, storing, treating, generating, managing post closure activity, and/or managing groundwater compliance sampling. All invoices are generated by the 15th of the previous month.



Upcoming Compliance Due Dates

- February 15:
 - Annual [Title V Air Permit fees](#) are due 30 days after receipt of billing. All invoices are generated by the 15th of the previous month.
- March 1:
 - [HC-500](#), Hazardous Chemical Inventory Fee Return (Tier II Report) due for previous year.
 - Invoice regarding the annual Underground Storage Tank (UST) fees for the last six (6) months of 2014 and the calendar year of 2015 sent to owners of registered USTs.
- March 2:
 - Annual [Manifest Report](#) due for Small Quantity Generators (SQG). Large Quantity Generators (LQG) and Treatment, Storage, and Disposal (TSD) Facilities must also submit on *even* numbered calendar years (e.g., 2016). Reports must be postmarked by March 2nd.



Upcoming Compliance Due Dates

- March 2:
 - Biennial [Hazardous Waste Report](#) due on *odd* numbered calendar years (e.g., 2015) for Large Quantity Generators (LQG) and Treatment, Storage, and Disposal (TSD) facilities. Reports must be postmarked by March 2nd.
- March 15:
 - Annual NPDES discharge flow fees due for every active permit as of January 1st of the current year or the first quarter payment is due if paying in quarterly installments.
- March 31:
 - Annual Green House Gas (GHG) Reports for the previous year are due to the U.S. EPA if facility is part of the [41 source categories](#) in [40 CFR 98](#), Table A-3, A-4, and A-5.
 - Please note, do not submit the GHG Reports to IDEM.

Greenhouse Gas Update

- IDEM's Position on the U.S. Supreme Court Ruling regarding Utility Air Regulatory Group vs. the U.S. EPA (the Tailoring Rule)
 - [Office of Air Quality \(OAQ\) guidance document](#)
 - IDEM does not intend to require Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) or Title V permits for sources based solely on greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.
 - IDEM will continue to apply a threshold of 75,000 tons per year (tpy) to determine when Best Available Control Technology (BACT) applies for Title V sources ("anyway sources").

UST Delivery Prohibition

- [LSA Doc #13-272](#)
 - Defines “delivery prohibition”
 - Ineligible under [IC 13-23-1-4](#)
 - Temporary order prohibiting the owner or operator of the ineligible UST from allowing a regulated substance to be delivered, deposited, or accepted.
 - Applies to owners and operators of a UST determined to be ineligible.
 - Ineligibility:
 - The required equipment is not installed including corrosion protection, leak detection, overfill protection, and/or spill prevention.

UST Delivery Prohibition

- [LSA Doc #13-272](#)
 - Ineligibility:
 - The owner or operator fails to:
 - Properly maintain equipment for corrosion protection, leak detection, overfill protection, and/or spill prevention.
 - Register the UST holding petroleum under 329 IAC 9-2-2.
 - Pay annual registration fees under [IC 13-23-12](#).
 - Notification:
 - Provided prior to delivery prohibition
 - Ineligible under section 5(1), determine immediate order of delivery prohibition
 - Ineligible under section 5(2), issue delivery prohibition after 30-day warning period

UST Delivery Prohibition

- [LSA Doc #13-272](#)
 - Delivery Prohibition:
 - A temporary emergency order per [IC 4-21.5-4](#).
 - Owner or operator of UST must notify the deliverer of the regulated substance of the delivery prohibition.
 - A red tag shall be attached to the UST.
 - Reclassification from ineligible to eligible:
 - Notification to IDEM all correction actions listed in notification have been taken
 - IDEM determines violations corrected by approving provided documentation or by re-inspection of ineligible UST

UST Delivery Prohibition

- [LSA Doc #13-272](#)
 - Special Circumstances to defer:
 - Prohibition would jeopardize access to motor fuel in a rural or remote area .
 - Ineligible UST is in a rural or remote area and there is not another UST containing similar type of fuel within 30 miles.
 - Delivery prohibition may only be deferred up to 180 days after determination of ineligibility.

 - 40 CFR 63, Subpart XXXXXX (6X) regulates potential emissions of cadmium, chromium, lead, manganese, and nickel from dry abrasive blasting, dry machining, dry grinding, spray painting, and welding.
