 - People have altered the landscape by introducing non-native plant species that have become invasive
 - People have also altered the landscape by damaging or removing wetland habitat buffer areas

Control Non-Native Invasive Species

- Herbicide Application
 - Imazapyr
 - ✤ Triclopyr
 - Glyphosate
- Prescribed Fire
- Mechanical
 - Mowing
 - Removal with heavy equipment

Establish Vegetation Buffers Around Wetlands

What is a vegetative buffer area?

• An area of vegetation intended to slow water runoff and filter out sediment, fertilizers, pesticides, and other pollutants

Establish Vegetation Buffers Around Wetlands

Vegetative buffers can include:

- Grasses
- Wildflowers
- Trees and Shrubs

Buffers are preferably native vegetation

 Native vegetation is healthier for the wetland and provides more value to wildlife

Establish Vegetation Buffers Around Wetlands

Vegetative buffer width:

- Buffers of 100' 300' widths are recommended
- The wider the buffer the better
- Small buffers are better than no buffers

Establish Native Wetland Vegetation

- Utilize the current seed bank
- Seed is spread naturally by air or birds and mammals
- Broadcast native seed
- Plant native vegetation plugs




