They currently enter foster home license information directly in Casebook, along with results of home studies. They also access Placement Referrals via KidTraks. Probation Officers (POs) – Manage juvenile justice cases, including placement and service referrals for DCS Juvenile Justice. POs use the DCS Probation Portal which gives them access to KidTraks for data entry of probation case, placement, and service referral information. In Phase I DDI, all case-related and referral- and placement-related data entry and exchange will be incorporated into the New CCWIS system. (Casebook will no longer exist and Probation functionality will be moved from KidTraks to the new CCWIS.) To satisfy the CCWIS CWCA requirement, an API will be created for LCPAs that have their own systems to enable the bi-directional exchange of Foster Family data, including Home Studies, licensing information, foster parent demographics, etc., along with the automated transmission of referral and placement information. Likewise, an API will be created that will enable multiple Indiana Court systems (JTS, Quest, and Odyssey) to share Probation-related case and hearing data to eliminate duplicate data entry.
