1	Attachment F: Scope of Work	If we chose 10 spots for this contract, can a student that uses CCDF use that spot or is it only for those that are awarded this CCDF contract?	If a provider is requesting 10 slots to be funded through this contract, those 10 slots must be filled by children that are eligible for CCDF but are not currently receiving a CCDF voucher. Funding to fill a slot through this contract will be given directly to the CCDF Agreement Center and not given to the family receiving the services. If a child filling a slot awarded under this contract leaves the provider, the CCDF Agreement Center may offer that slot to another child that meets the eligibility criteria.
2	Attachment F: Scope of Work	Is this contract different than the typical CCDF vouchers we currently receive? So if we have 10 spots, can we fill those 10 spots with a new client that is getting vouchers through their CCDF Intake Agent and/or this CCDF contract that we are applying for, or can we only use those spots for the children that are receiving this contract?	If you are not currently serving as a CCDF Agreement Center, this contract is different than the typical CCDF vouchers you currently receive. Clients that are already getting vouchers through their CCDF Intake Agent are not eligible to be served through funding from this contract. Instead, if you have a family that meets the eligibility requirements to get CCDF vouchers but has not been able to receive any (because, for example, they have not gotten off of the CCDF county waiting list or there is not enough voucher funding), you could use funding through this contract to serve this family at your program. This family would fill one of the "CCDF Slots" you apply to receive funding for through this contract. Additionally, funding from this contract will be given directly to your program as a reimbursement for serving the family.
