In those almost three years, we see daily the mental and emotional health and substance use disorder needs of our community. We would estimate for nearly ninety percent of the criminal defendants, juveniles, and families in our court, the root problem is undiagnosed or untreated mental or emotional health issues and/or substance use disorder, most commonly being a highly detrimental combination of both. These individuals are not criminals or delinquents by nature but engage in criminal or delinquent acts due to undiagnosed mental or emotional health issues and their substance use.

The current structure of the Community Mental Health Center, (CMHC), model is useful in some situations, but mental and emotional health and substance use disorder treatment is not conducive to a "one size fits all" approach. We feel that the CCBHC model will offer personalized treatment plans that better suit the needs of each person's specific treatment goals. Additionally, the 24/7 crisis response that will be offered by CCBHCs will be a crucial, additional asset in addressing mental and emotional health crisis from onset or at an apex.
