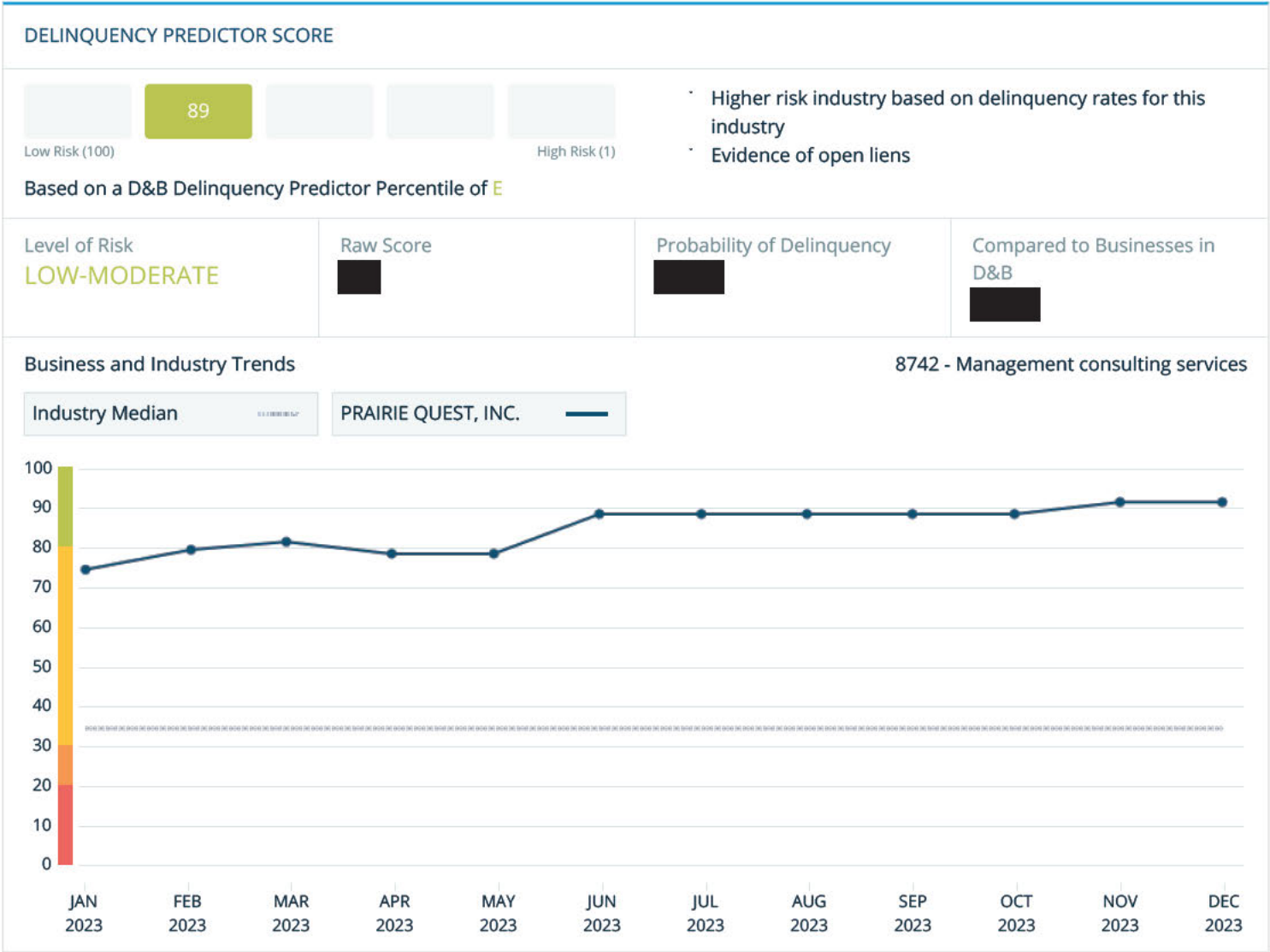

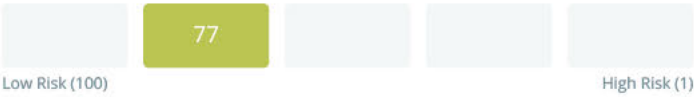

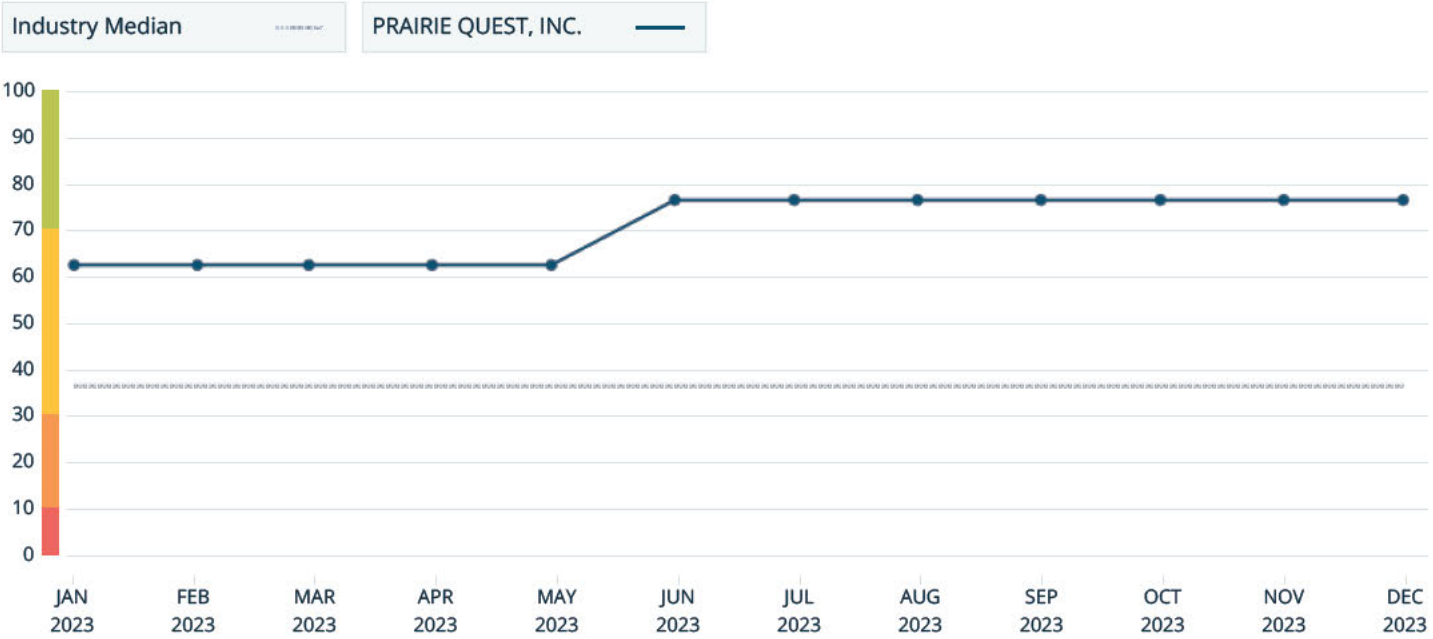

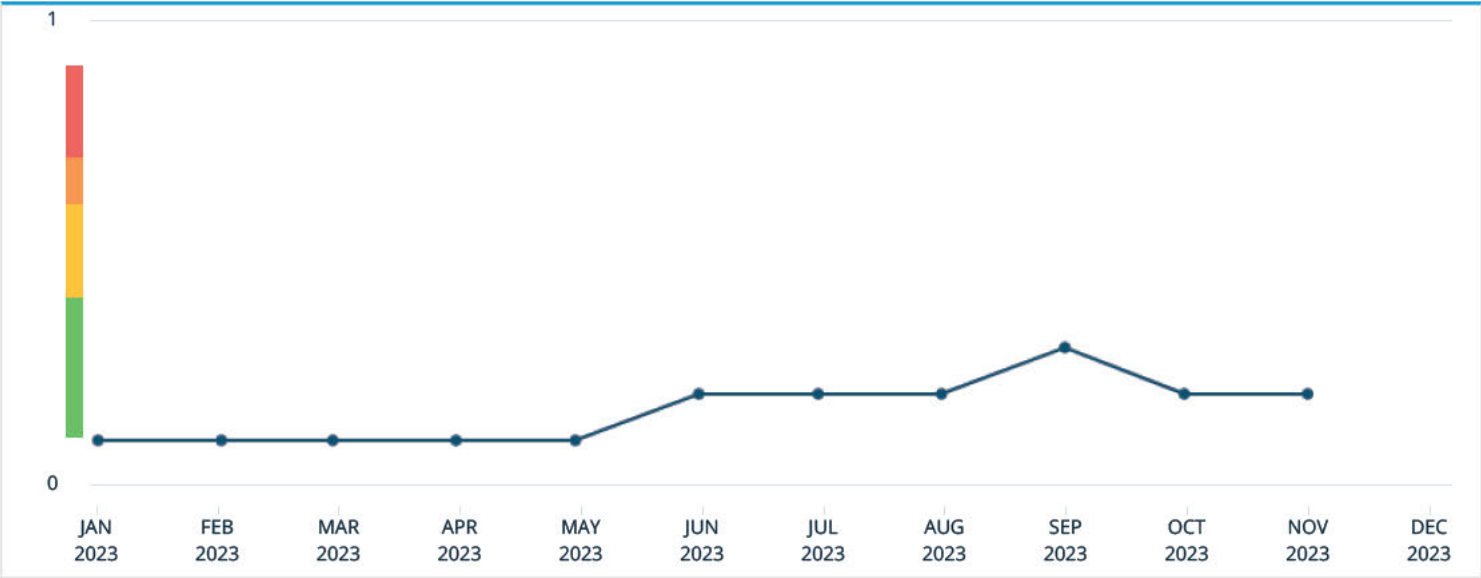

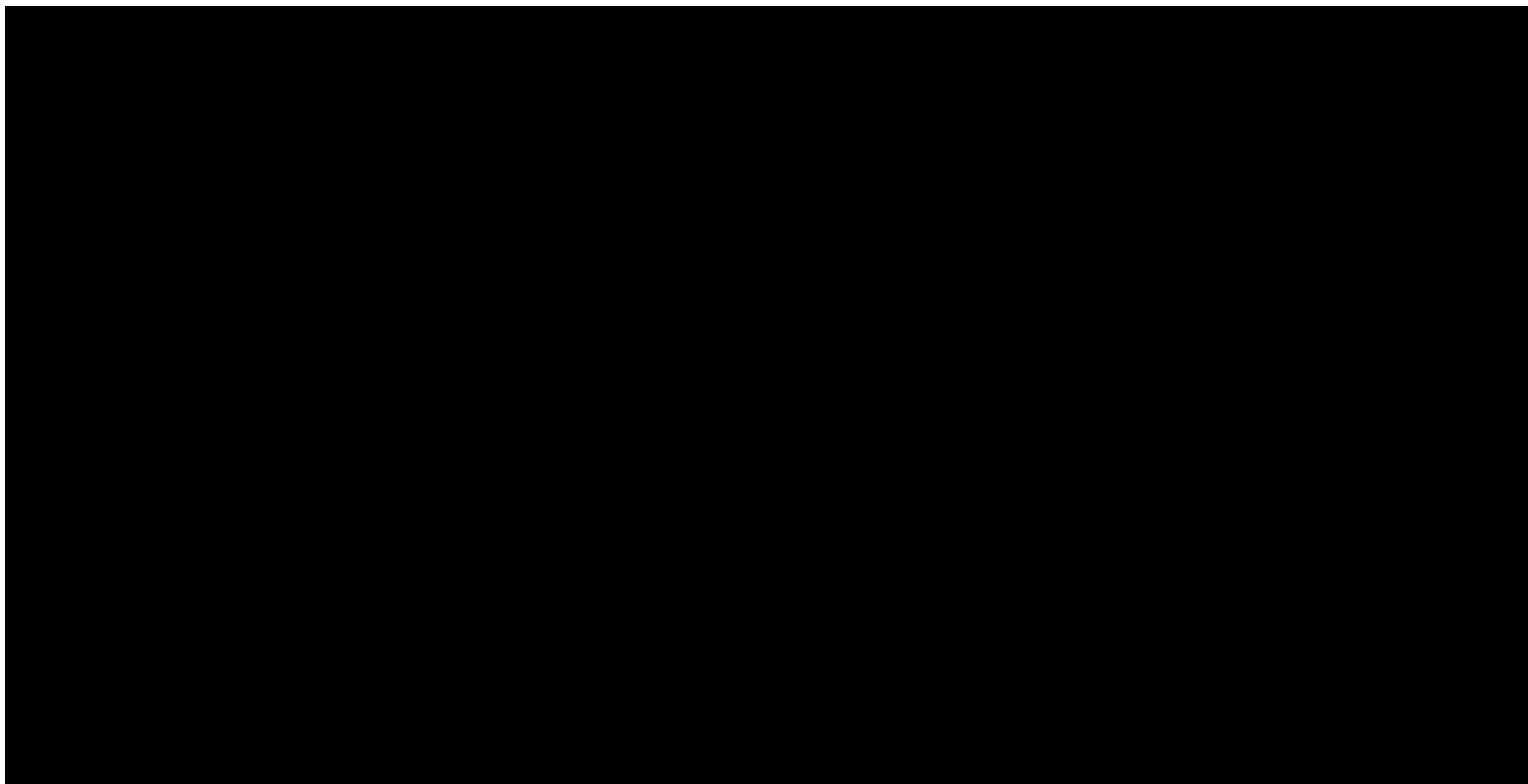


TRADE PAYMENTS BY INDUSTRY
