**RE: 2013 Madison County Youth Center Inspection
Conducted: November 6, 2013**

Dear Judge Pancol:

As required by 210 IAC 6, an inspection of the Madison County Youth Center's operation was conducted on November 6, 2013. The inspection was conducted by Vanessa Krause, Shannon Bowling and Jan Adams.

The Madison County Youth Center is operated by the Madison County Superior Court, and is located at 3420 Mounds Road, In Anderson, Indiana 46017. The Madison County Youth Center is a 32-bed juvenile detention facility primarily serving Madison County. The Detention Manager is Leshea Cates and the Director of the Madison County Youth Center is Gary Williams.

This inspection constitutes the sixteenth -annual inspection of the Madison County Youth Center. Compliance with all the mandatory standards and at least 90 % of the recommended standards is required to attain "full compliance" as outlined by 210 IAC 6-3. The inspection included a tour of the facility, review of all mandatory and recommended standards, and interviews with the detention staff and residents. Detention staff interviewed was well versed in policy and procedures, and were supportive of administrative staff. Residents interviewed offered no instances of abuse, and no complaints about conditions were noted.

Summary of the tour:

- The facility was very clean.
- Many activities were supplied for recreation for the students.
- The students seemed engaged.

Summary of the files:

- The files are still in paper files, not electronic.
- The files were well organized and documented well.

Listed below are recommended standards that were found to be in non-compliance:



3-5.303	Written procedure for releasing juveniles include but are not limited to the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none">-Verification of identity-Verification of release papers-Completion of release arrangements, including the person or agency to whom the juvenile is to be released-Return of personal effects-Completion of any pending action, such as grievances or claims for damaged or lost possessions-Medical screening and arrangements for community follow-up when needed-Transportation arrangements-Instructions on forwarding of mail

The facility does not have written procedures for a medical screening upon release.

The detention center was found to be in compliance with 100 % of all mandatory standards, and 99.63 % of recommended standards. A certificate of "Full-Compliance" will accompany this report which will become public information ten days after mailing. 
