The new Indiana Juvenile Detention Standards are in the process of being adopted, therefore the 19<sup>th</sup> annual evaluation of the Youth Care Center consisted of an audit of the current 26 mandatory compliance standards or the corresponding 16 newly proposed mandatory compliance standards. Compliance with 100% of the mandatory standards is required to attain "Full Compliance".

## SUBSEQUENT ANNOUNCED AND/OR UNANNOUNCED VISIT(S)

On 2/5/2016, a subsequent visit was conducted of the Youth Care Center by Chance Sweat. The facility tour was conducted by Director Head. Youth were observed participating in education and art classes under direct supervision of detention staff. The facility population count was 16. All areas of the facility appeared to be well-maintained, and the sanitation level in the facility was satisfactory.

On 9/1/2016, a second subsequent visit was conducted of the Youth Care Center by Chance Sweat. The facility tour was conducted by Director Head and youth were observed participating in education classes under direct supervision of detention staff and the facility population count was 16 youth. All areas appeared to be well-maintained sanitation levels in the facility were found to be above average.

## **TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE VISIT(S)**

The Youth Care Center's education technical assistance visit was conducted on 2/5/16 by Chance Sweat and Kristin Herrmann. The education program follows the local school corporation's calendar and provides special programming during extended breaks. An instructional day is five hours. Instruction is delivered via an on-site, licensed classroom teacher either utilizing a curriculum created at the facility, overseeing an approved online instructional program, or facilitating work assigned from the juvenile's home school. The method of instruction depends on the juvenile's need. Program staff includes one full-time teacher. The facility has access to a substitute teacher through the local school corporation.

The Youth Care Center's training and development technical assistance visit occurred on 6/6/16 and was conducted by Chance Sweat and Kristin Herrmann. The technical assistance provided included identifying key changes to the standards, answering questions, and discussing the facility's training plan.

## **CONCLUSION**

Youth Care Center is in full compliance with the 2016 Indiana Detention Center Standards Audit performed by the Indiana Department of Correction, Division of Youth Services.
