

Executive Summary

Beginning January, 2013 and including more recent months, the IDOC Offender Population Statistical Report includes several changes and additions not previously reported. Those changes are as follows:

- The population summary included in this report now includes overall admission and release counts.
- Tables 6, 7, 14 and 15 are new to this report. They detail number of new admissions by offense level and number of releases by release type, all broken down by county of commitment for offenders' most serious crime.
- Tables 9 and 10 (from previous reports) are now 11 and 12 and no longer include parole violation admissions or admissions for Community Transition Program (CTP) violations.
- Tables 11, 12, 16 and 17 have been modified to make them easier to read. These tables will continue to display admissions by offense for all citations and most serious offense.
- Tables 11 & 12 only report offenses which are admitted to IDOC and will no longer include offenses with a value of zero. Therefore, offenses which are not represented by the IDOC offender population will not appear on either of these tables.
- Starting June, 2013 the Human Resources report includes Indiana inter-agency transfers to and from IDOC.

Definitions

For the purpose of this report, the following definitions apply:

Admission – The means by which an offender enters the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of the return of an escapee, this does not include a return from a temporary absence.

Average Daily Population – The sum of the daily beginning counts for a month, divided by that month's number of daily beginning counts.

Beginning Count – The number of offenders physically present at the beginning of the day (ie, 0000:01 hours).

Class A Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of thirty years, with not more than twenty years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Class B Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of ten years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than four years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Class C Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of four years, with not more than four years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than two years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Class D Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of one and one-half years, with not more than one and one-half years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than one year subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

County Jail "Back-ups" (Jail Bed Count) – Those offenders who have been committed to the Indiana Department of Correction, but are housed in a county jail until they can be transferred to a Department of Correction intake facility. The county receives \$35.00 per day, per offender, to house these offenders.

Ending Count – The number of offenders physically present at the end of the day (ie, 2400:00 hours).

Felon – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for more than one year.

Level 1 Security Classification – Minimum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 1 have the least restrictive security measures in place.

Level 2 Security Classification – Medium security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 2 have a moderate degree of security measures in place.

Level 3 Security Classification – Maximum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 3 have very restrictive security measures in place.

Misdemeanant – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for not more than one year.

Murder - An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of fifty-five years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Operational Capacity – The total bed capacity of the facility. The capacity of a facility is the number of beds authorized for safe and efficient operation of the facility.

Pre-Dispositional – An individual ordered by the Court to the Indiana Department of Correction for evaluation prior to sentencing.

Recommitment – When an offender returns to IDOC after having served all or some of a sentence unrelated to the current sentence.

Release – The means by which an offender leaves the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of an escapee, this does not include a temporary absence.

Safekeeper – An individual whom the Court has determined to be in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death, or who represents a substantial threat to the safety of others, and whom the Court has ordered to the Indiana Department of Correction for custody and security control.

Secure Confinement Units – Denotes maximum control with the most restrictive security measures in place.

Vacancy – The number of beds available for assignment.

Indiana Department of Correction Population Summary

- There were 26,264 adult male offenders (including 752 county jail “back-ups” and 200 in contracted beds) on October 1, 2013. This population is 2% below operational bed capacity for general population.
- There were 2,644 adult female offenders (including 120 county jail “back-ups” and 116 in contracted beds) on October 1, 2013. This population is 4% below the operational bed capacity.
- There were 387 juvenile male offenders in the Department’s facilities on October 1, 2013. This population is 45% below the operational bed capacity.
- There were 58 juvenile female offenders in the Department’s facilities on October 1, 2013. This population is 63% below the operational bed capacity.
- There were 9,046 adult males on parole in Indiana (8,552 Indiana parolees and 494 other jurisdiction parolees) on October 1, 2013.
- There were 1,198 adult females on parole in Indiana (1,145 Indiana parolees and 53 other jurisdiction parolees) on October 1, 2013.
- There were 1,532 adults admitted to IDOC (1,251 male and 281 female) and 1,522 adults released from IDOC (1,272 male and 250 female) in September 2013.
- There were 50 juveniles admitted to IDOC (42 male and 8 female) and 91 juveniles released from IDOC (83 male and 8 female) in September 2013.



Average Daily Adult Female Offender Populations Fiscal Year 2013









Fiscal Year 2013






